

November Seminar:

The November seminar will be held at Glenn Johnson's house on Saturday, November 12, starting at 8:30 A.M. The subject will be kingpin replacement. Kingpins will be replaced on a club member's car. Jim Nichols will conduct the seminar.

Aires Stainless steel water pipes:

I have ordered another quantity of ten part number A8291 stainless steel water inlet pipes. The price is \$12.00 each. Eight were sold at the October meeting. There are two left and they will be available at the November general meeting.

December Seminar:

Due to a crowded calendar and holiday activities, there will be no technical seminar scheduled for December.

Technical Tip:

A fuel leak at either end of the fuel line on a Model A Ford is a common occurrence that is easily remedied. It should be understood that the threads on the fittings at either end do not seal off the fuel, and wrapping them with Teflon tape will not fix the leak. The ferrules on each end of the fuel line are what seals off the fuel. The ferrule is made of soft material and is designed to crush itself into the shape of the seat at the connection boss. After repeated removal of the fuel line connection the ferrule loses it's shape and no longer provides a good seal. This is especially true when you install a different carburetor. It is difficult to replace the ferrule, as it will have become pressed onto the end of the fuel line. The remedy is to wrap Teflon tape around the ferrule. Make four wraps completely covering the ferrule, but be careful not to get any tape over the end of the fuel line. The Teflon tape will provide a very good seal to a worn ferrule. Don't over tighten the fitting. I make it a practice to wrap both ends of the fuel line anytime I have removed it from the car. It is also a good ideal to leave the carburetor flange bolts loose until after you have tightened both fuel line fittings. This will ensure good alignment of the fuel line to the connection boss. ©

OCMAFC Military Veterans

Jim Nichols U.S. Army 1955-1958

At the age of 20, I entered the U.S. Army in August of 1955 on a "reserved for you" program, which allowed a person to receive the training of their choice after completing basic training. At Fort Ord, California, I was assigned to G Company of the 20th Infantry regiment of the 6th Army for my basic training. I adjusted to basic training pretty fast plus the added benefit of firing all of the different weapons was really exciting. Making sharp shooter with the M1 Garand rifle was fairly easy, since I was on a shooting team for two years with the local police department in West Los Angeles before enlisting.

After completing basic training and receiving a one-week leave I was on a flight to Fort Belvore, Virginia for my advance basic training in Engineering. Fort Belvore is located just south of Washington D.C. in the rolling hills of Virginia. There I received training in many different fields of military Engineering. Upon graduating from the Engineering school, our class received orders transferring us to many different military installations. Three of us received orders to proceed to Fort Benning, Georgia by train the next day. The following day we left Virginia with lots of snow on the ground and woke up the next morning to red color dirt (clay) almost everywhere. Welcome to Georgia!

My two traveling Engineering school companions wound up as truck drivers, while I ended up at the 3rd Infantry Division N.C.O. School of the 3rd Army. There I was put in charge of training aids, graphic designs, and drafting. In March of 1957 I decided to attend the U.S. Army Ranger School at Fort Benning. After passing the entrance tests and successfully passing the three-month training course I graduated in August 1957. I applied for, and was accepted as, an instructor at the Ranger school to teach hand-to-hand combat, basic survival, and demolitions.

While stationed at Fort Benning I met Joanne in September 1957. We were married in January 1958 and after my enlistment was over in August 1958 moved to California where we have lived ever since.






