

### **Technical 2006**

### **January Seminar:**

A technical seminar is scheduled for Saturday, January 14, 2006, 9:00AM-12:00 noon, at the CHOC hospital in our regular meeting room. The subject will be differential and rear axle assembly overhaul. There will be a lecture with a series of projected digital pictures of the various shop procedures employed in the overhaul. A complete disassembled Model A Ford differential and rear axle assembly will be on display. The Harbor Area MAFC and the Whittier MAFC have been invited to attend the seminar as our guests.

### **February Seminar:**

A Borg Warner overdrive repair seminar will be held at Tom Endy's house on Saturday, February 11, 2006, beginning at 9:00AM. A completely disassembled Borg Warner overdrive will be on display. The presentation will describe how to disassemble and determine failure modes. A detailed description of how the unit works, what each part does, and how to reassemble it will be provided. We will also dispel the myth of the rubber band.

### **Technical Tip:**

Borg-Warner overdrives converted for use on a Model A Ford are all a product of a cottage industry. Some are well made and some are not. One common fault they all have is a questionable rear oil seal. None are very well engineered, and some don't have one at all and rely on a sealed rear bearing to hold back the oil. Oil leaking out the rear of the overdrive will end up in the differential, and the owner will never know it unless the oil level in both the overdrive and differential are checked frequently. If excessive oil is allowed to accumulate in the banjo it will begin to fill the axle housings and migrate toward the brakes. The overdrive will also starve itself of oil and eventually fail.

If a Borg-Warner fails to operate correctly there are only three things that can be checked while still installed in the car. (1) Check that there is a proper amount of oil in the overdrive. (2) Check that the

solenoid actuates when powered, and if it was recently removed check that it is installed correctly by removing the two mounting bolts and pulling straight back on it. If installed correctly it will not come out, it will extend on the spring. (3) Check that the pull cable is moving the shift lever on the overdrive to its full travel in both directions. The setscrew on the cable may have slipped preventing full actuation. If it still doesn't operate correctly the unit will have to be removed from the car and disassembled to determine the fault.  $\odot$

### **OCMAFC** Military Veterans

### Everett Pearce U.S. Army Air Corps 1943-1946

When World War Two started December 7, 1941, I was living with my parents in Tustin, California. My cousin had talked me into joining the navy. I drove by the recruiting office at the post office to enlist three days in a row on my way home from work at Douglas Aircraft. There were no parking spaces for three or four blocks and I figured I would be walking enough in the service, so why walk to get in. A guy I had worked with joined the navy and he told me about being at sea after six weeks of boot camp. This dampened my enthusiasm for the navy so I decided to wait to be drafted.

In March 1943 I was drafted into the army at age 20. Atlantic City, New Jersey was where I was sent for basic training. I was assigned to the Signal Corps where I was scheduled to receive training as a radiotelephone repairman. During basic training I applied for the Army Air Corps Cadet program, I wanted to be a pilot. I was accepted into the program and had qualified for both pilot training and bombardier training. I was enrolled in pilot training and completed primary training in a Stearman PT-17, and more advanced training in a Vultee Valiant BT-13. Due to circumstances beyond my control I was not able to complete the pilot training program, and was sent to gunnery and bombardier school. I had completed B-24 flexible gunnery school and was at Las Vegas, Nevada for B-29 central fire control gunnery school when the war ended. Most of my time in the service was spent in training. I was stationed on 16 different bases in 13 different states. I was discharged in 1946 and returned home to Southern California.

### The Sacramento Tour:

### The tour group:

Our group was large, and included mostly Model A Fords, with a couple of moderns tagging along. Glenn & Sharon Johnson were our leaders. The others were Gary & Joanne Discher, Richard & Jeanne Parrish, Tom Endy & Lynn, Peiter & Judi Dwinger, and John & Dorothy Knox. Members from other local clubs who joined us were Allen & Susie Bennet, John & Dianne Frazee, Bruce Howe & Jeanette Smith, Roger & Carol Sandmeier, John & Bev Saulsbury, Roy & Sally Sheridan, and Keith & Jo Smith. At Sacramento we were joined by Mark Schwing, Drain & Doris Marshall and Walt & Carla Hibbard,

### The first day out (November 27):

The first day's destination was Paso Robles. We hooked up with the San Diego folks at the Citadel in LA and continued on to Santa Barbara where we stopped for gas. As we were exiting the freeway John Frazee's engine seized up in his Model A Delivery. We suspect he may have broken a piston as compression entered the crankcase and blew the dipstick out into the road. John had to have the car hauled home by AAA. He had just installed a newly rebuilt engine the week before fresh from an engine rebuilder. The engine rebuilder is going to be more so embarrassed since as you all know, John Frazee is the 2005 president of MAFCA. John & Dianne caught up with us in their modern the next day.

### The next day (November 28):

We departed Paso Robles on highway 41 heading for Oakhurst. I, like a Dork, neglected to gas up. I had slightly less than a half tank of gas. I figured we would stop down the road apiece and I could gas up then. We had only gone a few miles when I saw a sign that said next services 50 miles. I radioed and told the group to go on and we would catch up, we then stopped for gas.

We had just reached the junctions of 41 and 49 and were climbing a grade out in the middle of nowhere all by our selves when Miss Vic started boiling over. I had the headlights on and I glanced at the ammeter and saw it was pegging from +20 to -20, then finally

it went to a continuous –20. I pulled off the road and mentioned to Lynn that I thought I had just lost a fan belt. When I opened the hood, sure enough, the fan belt was shredded. When I told Lynn she had a stricken look on her face and asked what were we going to do? First I was going to let the car cool down, and then I was going to install the spare fan belt I had stashed behind the back seat. We caught up with every one in the next hour or so in a little town where they had stopped to wait for us. They wanted to know why it took me so long to gas up.

### The third day (November 29):

At Oakhurst it got down to 27° that night. This day's destination was Sutter Creek on old Highway 49. We encountered a cold drizzling rain the entire day and through the following night. Bottles of Rainex appeared from everywhere. We stopped in a number of the old gold rush towns along the way. We even stopped in Jackson, the place Johnny Cash was always singing about. By this time Allen Bennet's car was coating Highway 49 with a thin layer of oil. John Knox was seen fussing with his side curtains on his Phaeton a lot, and he and Dorothy were dressed as if they were at the North Pole.

### **Arrival in Sacramento (November 30):**

It was only a short distance from Sutter Creek to Sacramento. Allen Bennet put three quarts of 60W oil and a can of STP in the crankcase to be able to get to Sacramento. Arrangements were made there to trailer the car back to LA. At Sacramento we registered for the MAFCA National Banquet and spent the next several days there enjoying the meet and the various tours that had been set up. It rained the first day we were there, but for the rest of the time it was clear and cold.

#### The welcome dinner:

The welcome dinner was held right in the middle of the Towe Museum. We were taken there by bus where tables were set up for the dinner. There was also a bar set up and we were allowed to wander through the museum until the dinner started. The Towe Museum has a very fine collection of vintage cars and memorabilia.

### The State Capitol:

One of the tours I was particularly interested in was a tour to the capitol building where the Terminator, now known as the Governator prevails. We had an excellent docent, who grew with the Warren children that took us on the tour. The architecture of the building is magnificent. On the many floors there are large paintings of each of California's past governors. Most all are very well done conservative portraits, except for former Governor Jerry Brown. He had his portrait commissioned as a cartoon character. It looked rather strange to me, but to each his own I guess.

### **Sacramento Vintage:**

During our stay in Sacramento a number of us paid a visit to Sacramento Vintage, which is one of the largest Model A Ford, and V8 Ford suppliers in the country. It was like visiting a large memorabilia museum. The size of the facility and the large number of employees was most impressive. It was certainly one of the highlights of the tour.

### The MAFCA awards banquet:

The final evening in Sacramento the banquet for the installation of the new MAFCA board of directors and national awards was held at the hotel. During the newsletter awards the **Distributor** received an award for continuous excellence. This brought a rousing cheer from the Orange County table. Congratulations to **Peter & Ana Hyland**.

### The trip home (December 4):

The original plan was for all of us to stop overnight in Bakersfield. However a number of our group became homesick and wanted to highball it straight home. The San Diego folks, Lynn & I, and several others decided to stick to the original plan and vacation in Bakersfield. We departed Sunday morning and had an uneventful ride down Highway 99 to Bakersfield.

### **Dinner in Bakersfield:**

There were ten of us staying at the hotel. It was suggested we all go to a nearby Mexican restaurant for dinner. About half way through the meal I started to feel very strange. During the walk back to the hotel it became worse and it was accompanied

by chills. Shortly after returning to our room I was overcome by nausea, vomiting, and violent chills. This lasted through most of the night. I was in no shape for the 0800 departure in the morning and I asked Lynn to tell the other folks to go on without us. It was then we learned that Walt Hibbard had also become extremely sick. He got so bad he passed out and they had to call the paramedics. I didn't pass out, but I wished I could have. I have never been so sick. At the time we suspected it was food poisoning, however, it was strange that only two people out of ten became sick.

### The last leg of the journey (December 5):

By 10 AM I felt well enough to drive, but Walt was still too sick. It was decided that John Frazee would drive his Model A and Walt would ride in the modern. However, Walt's Model A refused to start. It was determined that the drive gear that runs off the middle of the cam was stripped out. The decision was to not mess with it, but to haul the car home by AAA. John & Dianne Frazee stayed with the Hibbard's waiting for the AAA truck and the rest of us headed for home. It was a rough ride home for me, but all of us made it safely.

Later I learned that a number of other people in our tour group came down with the same illness a few days later. I am of the opinion that what we encountered was stomach flu and not food poisoning.

### **Epilog:**

Despite the illness, the breakdowns, the rain, and the cold, it was a very good tour, and I think all who participated enjoyed it. Our thanks go to **Sharon Johnson** who did an excellent job organizing the tour. She provided each car with a book that contained information about how to get to each hotel and listed each couple and their cell number. It made it easy for us all to regroup when we got separated, and we all knew how to find the hotel. ©




