
The next big club event is the Progressive Brunch in September. We will need someone to volunteer their home for appetizers, main course, and dessert. Any volunteers?





Technical 2006

April Seminar:

A seminar will be held at Art Moore's shop on Saturday, April 15, beginning at 0900. The subject will be the installation of a fabric top on Art's 1932 Ford 3-window coupe. The body is off the frame and is sitting on a wooden roll-around dolly.

Art's shop is a commercial welding shop located in Montclair. If it is raining it won't matter, everything will be accommodated inside.

Take the 57 freeway north to I-10. Go east on I-10 and exit on Monte Vista Ave. Turn left on Monte Vista. Turn right on Arrow Highway. Claremont Welding is on the right. Look for a large sign.

May Seminar:

The May seminar has not been scheduled as yet.

Technical Tip:

A fuel leak at either end of the fuel line on a Model A Ford is a common occurrence that is easily remedied. It should be understood that the threads on the fittings at either end do not seal off the fuel, and wrapping them with Teflon tape will not fix the leak. The ferrules on each end of the fuel line are what seals off the fuel. The ferrule is made of soft material and is designed to crush itself into the shape of the seat at the connection boss. After repeated removal of the fuel line connection the ferrule loses its shape and no longer provides a good seal. This is especially true when you install a different carburetor. It is difficult to replace the ferrule, as it will have become pressed onto the end of the fuel line. The remedy is to wrap Teflon tape around the ferrule. Make four wraps

completely covering the ferrule but be careful not to get any tape over the end of the fuel line. The Teflon tape will provide a very good seal to a worn ferrule. Don't over tighten the fitting. I make it a practice to wrap both ends of the fuel line anytime I have removed it from the car. It is also a good idea to leave the carburetor flange bolts loose until after you have tightened both fuel line fittings. This will ensure good alignment of the fuel line to the connection boss. ☺

OCMAFC Military Veterans

Don Miller USN 1944-1946

I was born and brought up in Syracuse NY and in 1944, when I was 17, I took the tests to join the Naval Air Corps. I was accepted and told to wait to be called. A month later the Navy told me that they had all the pilots they needed and I wouldn't be called after all. I didn't want to be drafted so I joined the Navy and did my boot training at Sampson NY in the middle of winter. Not fun. From there I went to Air Traffic Control Tower Operators School in Atlanta GA. When I graduated I was assigned to the Naval Air Corps Training Station at Brown Field in Chula Vista CA where I stayed until 1946, a year after the war was over.

While at Brown Field we had squadrons of F4F Bear Cats, F6F Hell Cats, SBD Dauntless Dive Bombers, and TBM Torpedo Bombers. They were all carrier aircraft and went out on training missions every day. Occasionally they would have "Scramble" where all the aircraft on the field would take off at the same time. With almost 100 airplanes taking off as fast as they can, there was always an emergency, which caused chaos in the tower. We had a lot of emergency landings but fortunately no fatalities.

As the war was winding down, they assigned the first squadron of F8F Firebirds to the base. They were the first navy airplanes with tricycle landing gears and a jet engine in addition to the regular propeller engine. The jet was only good for 5 minutes as a boost for the propeller. To show off, the pilots would buzz the field with only the jet engine and with the propeller feathered and not turning. It was a strange sight to see a propeller plane flying without the propeller turning.

My time in the Navy was a great experience and a big benefit was that it paid for my college education at Syracuse University where I received a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

In February, we started to relive with you, William "Doc" & Darlene Ingwerson epic adventure in their 1931 Victoria thru Canada, to the Arctic Circle north of Fairbanks, Alaska.

The following continues the story taken from "The Restorer" Vol. 30, Issue 6, and March - April 1986.

When we left our story, Doc & Darlene had toured the Columbia Ice Fields, played on the Glacier, and looked down a 500-foot deep hole and then it was on to Jasper. The next morning we crossed into the Province of British Columbia & had a lunch stop in Prince George. Our stop this night was in the Buena Vista Motel at Vanderhoof. We were now on the Yellowhead Highway, going west to our destination, Prince Rupert. We had a sailing date on the Alaska Marine Ferry, Taku.

While we waited to board, we were fascinated by the sight of many bald eagles soaring high overhead. The Taku carried 500 passengers & 105 vehicles. The two-day trip was spectacular with cascading waterfalls & scenic bays. We had stops in Ketchikan, Wrangell, and Sitka & Juneau. Our six-hour layover in Sitka allowed us to visit Castle Hill, where Alaska changed ownership from Russia to the United States in 1867 and the first U.S. flag was raised over Alaska.

After some radiator trouble it was off to the Yukon. The travel across the Yukon was spectacular, with its misty mountains, river, wild life, & flowers starting to show. The trees were small & stunted due to the tundra & permafrost. We stayed in White River Lodge & the owner there talked with us for hours about his gold mining experiences. He had some beautiful nuggets to prove it.

All along the way, people were fascinated with our cars. They could not believe we had come so far. Even those people associated with classic or antique car clubs could not understand how we made it. They were sure we had them brought up by ferry from Seattle.







Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy came from Glendora. This was their first year attending. He had restored his Model A by himself, although is not a member of a club.


Bud and Vicky Barrlet from San Fernando Valley have been attending for eight years.


