

Technical 2006

December 2006:

There is no technical seminar scheduled for December.

Twelve-volt ahooguh horn:

An original Model A horn is designed to operate with a six-volt battery. When converting a Model A to 12 volts it will be necessary to make the horn compatible with the 12-volt battery. There are several ways this can be accomplished. Bratton sells an original looking horn that is manufactured to operate on 12-volts. The part number is 19810, but it is quite pricey. Bratton also sells a dropping resistor that will reduce the voltage to an original horn to 6-volts. The resistor is part number 20050 and it is designed to fit nicely inside the back cover of the horn. The resistor should not be confused with the horn relay he also sells, part number 20040. The relay is intended to provide a better ground to a 6-volt horn than what is being provided by the grounding of the horn button. It is not intended for 12-volt use. A Model A horn will operate with either a positive or negative ground.

A Commercially available zero to two-ohm variable power resistor rated at 100 watts will also work very well. The variable adjustment will allow you to fine tune the ahooguh sound. One such resistor is an Ohmite D100K2R0 available from Newark electronic stores. 1-800-463-9275. ©

OCMAFC Military Veterans

Gary Chambers USNR \ USAFR 1963-2003


I was born in Pasadena and raised in the San Fernando Valley. In the spring of 1961, just before high school graduation, I signed up in the U.S. Naval Reserves in Van Nuys, California. From June 1961 until June 1963 I was attached to the Reserve Unit as a Boatswains Mate. For one year I was assigned to the USS Vammen Reserve Ship until I went on active duty from July 1964 to July 1967. During that time I did two tours of duty in Viet Nam as a naval corpsman aboard aircraft carriers, and finished active duty in Monterey California at the U.S. Naval Post Graduate School Medical Department. I was discharged on a Friday and walked into that same Van Nuys Naval Reserve Center on Saturday to sign up again! They were stunned and said that never happened before! From July 1967 until March 1975 I remained in the Naval Reserve, while working for the L.A. County Sheriff's Dept. and attending college. In June of 1973 I graduated from nursing school and began work as a Registered Nurse with the Sheriff's Dept (LA and then OC). I left the enlisted ranks for a commission as a 2nd Lt. in the California Air National Guard/USAFR. From 1975 to 2003 I served as the Medical Supply Officer, assistant Training Officer, Assistant Chief of Standardization and Evaluation, Chief of Standardization and Evaluation, Chief Nurse, and then Commander. I rose in the ranks to Lt. Col, and was Commander (9 years) of the 146th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron @ Channel Islands California Air National Guard, Oxnard, CA. From 1995 until retirement in 2003 I worked full time as an Air Reserve Technician at the base. While I was Commander, the unit became the #1 Aeromedical Unit in the U.S. During my career in the CANG, I had several international command positions, which included stints in the Ukraine and Germany. I served as Deputy Chief Aeromedical Evacuation Forces for contingency Operations for: Operations Joint Guard, Joint Forge and Enduring Freedom in Ramstein Germany. From 1995 to 2003 I led Diplomatic Medical Missions to the Republic of Chile. For outstanding contributions to the Republic of Chile I was awarded The Distinguished Service Medal from the Chilean-Fuerza Aerea De Chile, only the 2nd North American to receive that honor.

On a personal note, I met my wife Marilyn at a college bar near Cal State Northridge in Sept. 1966 and we were married the following September, with most of our courtship via letters that were usually six weeks old. We are both native Southern Californians, raised in the San Fernando Valley, and escaped to Orange County in 1973. In September 2006 we celebrated 39 years of marriage. Our daughter Christa and son Gary were born during the college years; we are now the proud grandparents of four (Brandon, Jack, Gabriella, Gracie), and Lucas is due in Feb. In April 2003 I completed a 42-year career in the United States military. I didn't start out with that goal in mind, it just happened. I currently work for the County of Los Angeles Emergency Medical Service Agency, Disaster Services, Hospital Bio-terrorism Program as a Senior Disaster Analyst. I love what I do and the people I work with, and only work four days a week. It is like being retired and getting paid for it. I have not completely given up the military, oh no, I am currently the Commander of the Scottish American Military Society (SAMS) Post 10, aka the BG James "Jimmy" Stewart Post, for greater Los Angeles. Women's coats followed the style of the era, often with special detailing on the front and back panel and slenderizing long straight lines. When worn in fashion judging, coats and wraps fall under the category of "Coordinated Apparel", and help to complete an outfit.

Daytime, sport, and evening coats generally conformed to the following trends: Spring and summer coats were usually fabric, with occasional fur trim on collar and/or cuffs. Fall and winter coats sported much fur trim. Luxury winter coats were all fur, frequently seal or beaver. Less expensive coats came in muskrat, coney rabbit, opossum, or fake velour plush, as well as suede and horsehide. The coats of 1928-29 usually fastened on the left with one button or clasp low on the hipline, or were belted low, or both. The silhouette was tapered, wide at the hips to fit comfortably but narrower at the hemline. The dress did not show beneath the hem of the coat.

The exception to this was a short jacket or cape worn for evening attire, and scarves of velveteen, georgette, chiffon, silk crepe, fox, squirrel, mink or marten. Feather boa's in assorted colors, including black, brown, beige, blue, red and white, were often worn for evening wear throughout the Model A era.

Associate Kathie McCall has a very special interest and it involves CHOC.

Did you know that there is a Model A Club here at CHOC? The club itself has been been in existence since 1964 and has been meeting at CHOC for the

The Model A Ford was Henry Ford's greatest accomplishments during the Great Depression when so many people were out of work and there were no jobs available. He instituted the factory/assembly line model to build thousands of these cars. The going rate of pay was \$5.00 per day, which was more than most people were making. The cars cost between \$300 to \$500.00. The years encompassed 1928 to 1931 for the Model A line of automobile and was affordable to even the working class.

Today these restored cars are often worth more than \$25,000,00 and have proven to be quite the past time for all ages of enthusiasts. The Model A is often a participant in the Great American Race and the object of many high school auto shop classes since it has the original piston driven combustion engine.

Two years ago 12 of these cars (mine included) were shipped to Hawaii via freighter and joined by their owners 3 weeks late r(by air) to tour all over the big island of Hawaii on the little back roads escorted by local islanders who also have a club there. This summer several club members journeyed to Massachusetts for a National "A" Convention via Amtrak traveling first class in Pullman cars and meeting up in Boston with other "A" owners to meet, greet, kick tires and tour around New England.

The "A" Club has made an annual contribution to CHOC for several years now. One year they purchased a digital camera to be used by the Reading Program and first floor Clinic, another year the contribution went to purchase a refrigerator to be used by the EVS staff in their employee lounge and other dollars went to the CHOC Foundation. They have contributed books for the Reading Room and new toys/games at Christmas for the In-Patient units. In addition thousands of toiletries and personal hygiene items have been collected and distributed to the Ronald Mc Donald House. In fact, last year we were told to hold off since they had a surplus of 'stuff'.

The Club feels very privileged to be able to meet at CHOC in the Education Center for their evening meeting. The old cars are protected with covered parking and access into the building is easy for some of the 'more senior' members. All have come to love CHOC and would do even more if made aware of the need.




