## **OCMAFC Military Veterans**


## Pieter Dwinger USMC 1961-1965

I joined the Marine Corp reserves in April of 1961 while still in high school in Santa Monica. I was in the high school ROTC program sponsored by the Marine Corps. After graduating from high school I attended Santa Monica City College, but decided during my first semester to go into the Marine Corps full time.

After going through boot camp that all Marine enlisted and officer candidates must participate in, I was selected to go to Memphis Tennessee to train for a position as an instructor in flight simulators. In 1962 I was transferred to El Toro where I trained pilots in the A4, F9 and F4 jets. The simulators, at that time, were used mainly to bring pilots up to speed on new instrument flight procedures, and to instruct and test on various Marine and Navy operational flight profiles.

In my off-hours at El Toro I was the Marine Corps and Navy swim team coach. During the summer of 1964 and the first half of 1965 I taught the commanding officer's two blind sons how to swim. I was scheduled to be discharged from the Corps in August of 1965. During the first week of August of 1965 most Marine Corp discharges from active service were cancelled, including mine, due to the rapid escalation in the Viet Nam arena. Much to my surprise the base commanding officer called me into his office on August 24, 1965. He told me to pack my belonging since I was being discharged in two days! He did say that I would be in the reserves in case I was needed to train more pilots. I was not called back. A week or so later I was back in college full time.

During most of my time at El Toro I kept a horse at the base stables, which I rode in the hills behind El Toro. On weekends I conducted horse riding and horse care classes for Marines/Navy personnel and their family members.

(Response) Stephanie – Your request for videos seem simple enough, buttttt, I'm in possession of <u>no</u> videos at all. I should be. The Historians Purpose Statement reads as follows. To collect, catalog, and store all documents and club memorabilia, in a way that protects these historical items, so that active members will have access to all archived items. I will locate these VHS Tapes & check with our Board for a policy regarding loaning of club property.

Just when it seems to be going along well, "It hits the fan", if you know what I mean.

The Board decides to keep the videos with the Merchandising Chairperson & not loan Videos outside our membership due to possible loss in mailing.

## Hemmings Photo Shoot, Article 1 By Glenn Johnson

Last August I was at a car show with my Model A Station Wagon. After the show, I found a card on my seat from Jeff Koch, a guy who photographs cars for Hemmings Motor News. On the back of his card he wrote that he would like to photograph my station wagon for the Hemmings Motor News Model A Ford calendar. When I got home I emailed Jeff and said that would be great and that I knew of several other model A's in my club that might also be candidates for the Model A calendar. He said he was interested and that he'd be getting back to me soon.

About a month ago Jeff emailed me that he was ready and could I start contacting my Model A friends so we could schedule the photo shoot. I'm familiar with most of the cars in our club so I went through the roster and made a list of the ones that I thought looked like stock Model As (factory colors, stock wheels etc.) and called their owners. I told them what was going on and everyone said yes. We scheduled the photo shoot for Tuesday Mar. 13th and Wed Mar. 14th beginning at a parking lot in Orange for the detail shots followed by the overall shots in Irvine Regional Park.

Everything was going as planned until Monday Mar. 13th when the Anaheim Hills fire started and Irvine Park became the command center for the fire fighters and their equipment. The park was closed for the week. After some confusion, our photo shoot was rescheduled for the next week, Mar. 20th and 22nd. Tuesday the 20th was a cloudy day, perfect for photography, but threatening rain. Five cars braved the weather and met in Orange as scheduled. Jeff took the detail photos and we all headed up to Irvine Park. A little drizzle and a few drops didn't scare us away, so Jeff proceeded to photograph our five Model A's. As he began to shoot the last car, a park ranger pulled up and told us that we needed a permit to photograph cars in a county park. Diana Stewart went with the ranger back to the ranger station to get the permit paper work while Jeff continued taking pictures of the last car. By the time they returned, we were done.

On Wednesday I took the paper work to the county office in Santa Ana and tried to wiggle out of having to get a permit and pay the fees. I left without the permit or a definite answer whether or not we really needed one. Bureaucracy is always fun but frustrating. It seems like no one ever has the authority to make a decision on their own. Thursday the 22nd was bright and beautiful and 11 Model As met our photographer in Orange for more detail pictures before touring back to Irvine Park. Jeff and five or six Model As passed through the park entry gates and disappeared into the park. I got stopped by the ranger.

"Where's your permit" he asked. I tried to explain to him that the lady at the county office couldn't decide if we actually needed a permit but he was insistent that we did. While we argued, Jeff and the first five or six Model A's were somewhere in the park taking pictures. I don't think the rangers knew that they were already in. As the cars came out of the park one by one, we all gathered in the parking lot and then followed Jeff to a second location where he shot the second group of cars. We finished around 6p.m. and all headed for home. In the two days, Jeff photographed Sixteen Model As that will be seen in the Hemmings Motor News Model A calendars in 2008, 2009 and 2010. Jeff said that 95 percent of what he shoots gets used, so be patient and look for our Orange County Model As in Hemmings calendars for the next few years.

## Hemmings Photo Shoot, Article 2 By Jeff Koch, West Coast Associate Editor

One of the many tasks I have in my position as West Coast Associate Editor at Hemmings Motor News is to find quality Model A Fords for our yearly best-selling calendar. At a local So Cal Concours d'Elegance last summer, I dropped a business card in Glenn Johnson's '29 Woody, and disappeared, as I often do. We communicated on and off over the next few months, and when Glenn said he had a few friends with cars that matched my brief of "restored to original and super-clean" for the calendar, I figured there would be five or six cars--enough to get most all of them into the 2008 edition. This event could not possibly have taken place without his and his very, very patient wife Sharon's help. Whatever efforts come of these afternoons, they are the ones who made it all possible. I'm grateful to them for making my job relatively easy!




