

Notes From Your President Mark Schwing. . .

February 2009 President's Letter



On Saturday, January 31 I was able to attend a good portion of the MAFCA board meeting at the La Habra headquarters. The new 2009 board is headed by President Brian Freestone from Canada. With Mr. Freestone's hands firmly griping the steering wheel we will have to wait and see just what direction MAFCA is headed in for this year. Two board members resigned within five weeks of the annual Membership meeting in Mesa, AZ, in early December. Rumor and correspondence indicate they were not pleased with the direction they perceived the new administration to be headed. Thev have been replaced by two board appointees. The first is Jim Morris from Ithaca, NY, who was the next in line in balloting this past election cycle. Rather than going to the next candidate in line behind Mr. Morris, the board appointed past MAFCA president and current MAFFI president George Tynan to the board.

The board held a closed to the membership planning session Friday before the open Saturday board meeting. Mr. Freestone made it abundantly clear they intend to do more of the same. While suggesting they want to be open to input from the MAFCA membership, their actions so far seem to say just the opposite. Time will tell.

By the way MAFCA membership revenues at the end of December 2008 are down \$69K from December of 2007. Their sales of books and other organization accessories were also down as was advertising revenue for the Restorer. They announced a balance of \$251K in their operating fund and \$535K in their building reserve fund which they consider as self insurance for any earthquake damage to their building

The High Country Tour is scheduled for June 14-19, 2009 in Breckenridge, Colorado at the Beaver Run Resort. This event was last held in 2001 and is a great event. The theme is "a look back in time". Breckenridge is about a two hour drive west of Denver high in the Rockies on Interstate 80. Many back country road tours, technical seminars, swap meets, craft workshop and plenty of fellowship events are scheduled for the week. TECHNICAL 2009

January Technical Session

Saturday the 10th was the date, Paul Steed's garage was the place and "Stainless Steel Maintenance" was the subject. The session was well attended, crowded might be the right term, with approximately 24 individuals present. Paul Steed described the processes involved in removing minor damage/imperfections in the stainless hardware and restoring the luster via polishing. He stressed the notion that "haste makes waste" and the danger inherent in using a polishing wheel. It is not too difficult to overheat the part or have the polishing wheel "catch" the part and instantaneously relocate it to the other side of the garage. Paul demonstrated the process on a sample part; go slow, remove dents a little at a time and use light pressure when polishing! No, he did not lose the part! At the end of the morning we all had a better idea of how involved the restoration of stainless steel parts really is. As usual, the attendees were adept at disposing of the coffee and donuts provided; no instruction required.

February Technical Session


How about a safety inspection before we start thinking of taking our Model A's out into traffic? It's time to check the clevis pins, the cotter keys, the lights and horn. How about wheel alignment, tires, brakes and fluid levels? If these and other items are of concern to you why not venture over to John Knox's residence in Brea and address the concerns. The session will be held on February 21, starting at 9:30am. John's address is: 1146 North Puente Street, Brea, CA. See you there.

Technical Clue (for those of us that are clueless)

This month's clue comes to us from an anonymous tipster and has to do with reworking a "scrap" distributor rotor into a "tool" to assist in setting the timing for your model A. The rotor is to be modified as described in the three steps below.

- 1. Remove the top rotor contact spring. (bend back and break off)
- 2. Remove half of the rotor contact arm; see illustration (can be done with hack saw or grinding wheel)
- 3. Drill 7/16 in hole through center of the rotor socket

When timing your Model A, replace the "good", functioning rotor with the reworked rotor. The reworked rotor allows access to the "cam screw" through the 7/16 in hole; it provides visible centerline alignment of the rotor-contact-arm to the distributor-housing-contact and, also provides a "handle" to control the shaft "back-lash" during tightening or loosening of the distributor cam screw.

USS Los Angeles CA-135

The USS Los Angeles was the last of the heavy cruisers of World War Two. It was commissioned in mid 1945 and joined the fleet too late to participate in the war. For two years it carried the flag around the Pacific. Its home port was Long Beach, California. In 1947 it joined the mothball fleet in the back bay of San Francisco.

When the Korean War began in June 1950 the Los Angeles was re-commissioned and joined the Pacific Fleet. Once again its home port was Long Beach. The LA, as she was known, and often referred to as "LA's Own", made a number of deployments to the Korean War zone. The LA's main batteries of eight-inch guns bombarded numerous North Korean coastal installations including the port of Wonsan. During one of its deployments it was hit by North Korean shore batteries and slightly damaged. The LA was decommissioned in 1963 and sold for scrap in 1977.

The next time you are rolling down Lampson Ave. in Seal Beach headed for the John & Gwen Riggs' house, take notice of the very large-scale model of a ship floating in the lake in the middle of the Los Alamitos military golf course. It is a model of the USS Los Angles, with CA-135 clearly painted on its bow.



Tour to Union Station-Los Angeles

On this warm and sunny Saturday morning 9 Model A's and 1 red Thunderbird with a total of 21 people set out from Coco's on Valley View headed for Union Station in Los Angeles. This was an all-surface road tour, which had been scoped out by Wagon master John Riggs and trusty navigator Gwen. What a tour it was, one member described it as "Mr. Toad's Wild Ride" as we traversed through parts of L.A. never before seen, Bellflower along Blvd, Lakewood (Rosemead) and finally Washington Blvd. We drove over what we recognized as a truck route past the wholesale markets for produce, flowers, toys and various and sundry other industrial products. All in all it was a very eye-opening and educational journey just getting to our destination. Union Station itself was pretty quiet, even on a Saturday morning and there was plenty of time to explore and appreciate the beauty, planning and architecture of this landmark, finished in 1939. There was much to see and investigate including the now closed original Fred Harvey Restaurant. The spacious rooms were opened up for our group and we imagined what it was like in its heyday. The design throughout these magnificent buildings still leaves the observer in awe when reflecting back to the 1920's and 30's when it was built. We were able to observe several of the Amtrak trains coming and going and travelers with their suitcases either waiting in the still beautiful and spacious waiting rooms or outside patios, or disembarking

from near or far away places. Eight pairs of ramps lead to loading platforms after traversing through the 500 feet tunnel, ending at the 16 public tracks, 2 if which are used for Metro Gold Line. Following our walking tour we got back in the cars to travel just 2 blocks down Alameda Blvd. to "The original" Philippe's Restaurant, famous for its French dip sandwiches, hot mustard condiment and .09 cent coffee! What a surprise after everyone jockeying for a parking spot when we stepped inside to find at least 15 people behind the order counter trying to keep up with the hundreds of people placing their orders. The restaurant and building itself is celebrating 100 years in business, and it doesn't look like they'll be going out of service any time soon. We found that Philippe's has been highlighted on the Huel Howser (California's Gold) program and was recently featured on a major television network as the BEST place in L.A. for a sandwich. It's definitely worth the experience, as is the Union Station. While at the restaurant we recognized Gwen Riggs 84th birthday with a hearty rendition of Happy Birthday. Gwen and John planned this tour and those of us who benefited from their efforts are appreciative of the time and effort they put into making it a very special day. A small group of 3 A's drove another few miles up the road to the San Antonio Winery for a cup of coffee and a peak into the beautiful dining room and wine tasting counter, while the others found their way back home. If you haven't been on a tour with the OCMAFCA, get your car out of the garage (either your modern or your A) and meet some new friends or spend time

with the established friends.


