Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup> is the date this year for our 48<sup>th</sup> Annual Pancake Breakfast. This event is our single most important event of the year as it is our major fund riser. Your efforts in helping with the breakfast and the many hundreds of Model A fans who attend enable OCMAFC to support two local scholarships, both the national youth scholarship and youth restoration award programs and make possible a donation to CHOC each year. It also supports the annual progressive brunch and helps reduce the cost of the annual December installation banquet.

This year, early cleanup crews should not arrive at Hart before 5:30 AM and we should plan on serving breakfast no earlier than 7:45 AM. These slightly later starting times are to minimize early noise that can disturb the residential neighbors of the park. The better we can be in our efforts for early morning quiet, the more likely we will be invited back next year.

Oh by the way, no vehicles on the grass just like last year and we need to limit the upper area to just one vehicle at a time to unload. That means the equipment van and trailer; the food truck and the grill truck will have to be coordinated so only one is on the upper level at a time and then moved to the parking lot. The same rule applies to the load out following the breakfast.

Our Pancake Breakfast is the largest gathering of Model A Fords in southern California during the year. The event attracts folks from every southern California Model A club, even drawing folks from central California and Arizona. You will have a chance to see at least one of nearly every model Ford made. This event also brings out more OCMAC members than any other event, tour or seminar that we do. I would like to extend my personal thanks to each of you who will come out and help on the 29<sup>th</sup>. We never have too much help and can always use more. If nothing else, slip on an apron and relieve someone on the grill line and flip a few pancakes.

As usual we will have our now famous raffle with lots of Model A and other goodies again. The grand prize will be a set of four black wall Firestone tires, either 19" or 21". We have bell housing and a shifter tower from Tom Endy and many items from Mel Gross including a set of cast iron brake drums. There are also numerous tools sets and other items. My thanks to all who donated or furnished raffle prizes. You will be recognized in next month's *Distributor*.

### **TECHNICAL** 2009

### February – March Technical Session

Well, here it is the end of the month and report time. Let's see what kind of session/s we managed.

### Impromptu Session

What do you conclude when your oil level "dip stick" comes out covered with a thick "malt-like" substance? If you said "water mixed with oil" you would be right. Well, Curtis Buck reported just such a problem and requested a little help in

the resolution. Members of the "A" team (Pete Hyland, Richard Parrish, Lew Lewis and I) diagnosed the problem as "loss of head-bolt torque and subsequent blown head gasket". Sure enough, upon removal of the head, it was verified that the gasket was separated between cylinders #3 and #4 while a water leak was evident at cylinder #4. Several problems existed which involved the water pump; the cooling fan was loose and just beginning to scrape the radiator and the pump shaft was unrestrained laterally. The head gasket was replaced and the head-bolts were re-torqued but final verification of problem resolution will have to wait for a new water pump. As you can see from the picture it looks like Richard Parrish is hard at work; then again, you can't believe everything you see.

### February Technical Session

As scheduled, we met at John and Dorothy Knox's home in Brea for a check of "undercarriage" components. The fact that John let us use his lift made this activity a whole lot easier. Nine dedicated Model A'ers and 2 model A's were present. Among the notable items detected were loose body-to-frame bolts, mis-located body blocks, brake-rod clevis lock-nuts, present but not used and, bent brake rods. (Pictured to the right

are John Knox, Richard Riggs, Greg Earhart and Fred Brand.) Not all problems were resolved but attention was focused and, hey, you have to save something for later. Can't say the same for the donuts and coffee; nothing saved there.

### March Technical Session

So, what is the tech session planned for March? How about a slightly non-technical session; one where we check your speedometer-indicated speed against a GPS indicated reading. We can do this at several speeds; say 20, 30, 40 and

50mph. This will give you the deviation and linearity of your speedometer. No correction will be attempted; perhaps that can be the subject of a future session. The trials will be held on Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup>. If you would like to have breakfast at IHOP in Placentia before the trials, please let me know by March 12<sup>th</sup> so I can give them a head count.

So, breakfast at 8am and trials beginning at 9am. We will meet for the trials at the corner of Crowther and East Orangethorpe Avenues in Anaheim; see map.

The top of the map is North. From the #91 Freeway East, take the Kraemer Exit North to Orangethorpe Ave, right on Orangethorpe to the indicated parking. There is a liquor store on the corner, parking is

at the rear of the store. "Junction Liquor" at 3353 E Orangethorpe Ave, Anaheim, CA

### Historian

A recent reunion with returning member Ed Coté reminded me of a story he told me many years ago of his grandfathers cousin, and a scandalous account of Henry Ford's past of which you may not have been aware.. Evangeline Coté began work at Ford Motor Company in 1909 at the age of 16. About 1922 Henry Ford took notice of Harold Wills's pretty secretary and acquired her as his personal assistant, *and then some*.

At age 61, 30 years her senior, Henry became her supervisor, part time father, her *lover*, and father of *their son*.

Clara was not oblivious of the indiscretion but seemed willing to let it continue knowing her marriage was secure and she was relieved of "that kind" of attention at home.

Henry attempted to keep things under wraps by arraigning the marriage of Evangeline to his chauffeur Ray Dahlinger. He rewarded him with a job as head of Ford Farms. When, in 1923, Evangeline gave birth to a son John, Henry insisted he wear the christening gown he had worn, and also gave him the bed that Henry himself had slept in as a baby. It was already widely rumored throughout Dearborn that the child was Henry's. Henry lavished the young married couple with gifts of a 300 acre farm, a summer place near his own in upper Michigan and a tract of land next to his own Fairlane for a permanent home. Leading from a small room downstairs to Evangeline's bedroom was a secret staircase known to Henry but apparently unknown to her husband. Sometimes he would come to the house early in the day gliding silently up the river in Clara's electric boat. On his approach, the watchman would ring a buzzer in the house and all tobacco and liquor would be hidden from Henry, who abhorred such habits. He would say "Good morning Ray is Billie home"? That was his pet name for her. They would stroll through the woods enjoying

nature and each other's company.

Everyone commented how young John looked so much like Edsel. When Henry commissioned the company artist to do a series of paintings of his life, he suggested using John as the model for Henry's boyhood era.

He took the boy for walks in the woods, held long discussions and even played duets on Jew's harps which he brought along for the occasion. He arranged play sessions for John with Easel's sons who were about the same age and had a motorized miniature car custom-made for him just like theirs. It was quality time spent with a son which had been unavailable to his first son, Edsel. In 1977 John "Coté" Dahlgren wrote a book, *The Secret Life of Henry Ford.* In his book he elaborated on his childhood and claimed to be Henry Ford's illegitimate son.

# <u>Technical Clue (for those of us that are clueless)</u>

This month's clue is taken from the "tiny tips" article in the September – October, 2003, issue of the MAFCA Restorer Magazine. Submitted by and previously published in the AaaOOOgah newsletter, Ohio Valley Region and illustrated by Dick Lewis, Lawrenceburg, Indiana.

If you do not have a bushing removal tool and you need to remove a bushing from a distributor, water pump, oil pump, etc., here's a neat trick. Use a



tap to tap threads inside the bushing. Screw a bolt into the bushing and tap it out from either end with a rod and hammer.

### A Tiny Tip! Distributor Timing

A number of years ago I discovered that it was possible to set the ignition timing on a Model A Ford, drive the car awhile, and then remove the distributor without losing the timing setting. You could drop it into the car a year later without having to re-set the timing and it would work fine.

I recommended to people that they should do this. As long as the center screw in the distributor is not loosened the timing setting remains intact. A properly set distributor removed from your running car and carried as a spare is a good thing to have on a tour. If you suspect you are having problems with the distributor that is installed, the spare can be dropped right into the car without having to reset the timing and you are good to go. I have done this a number of times and it has worked well.

Recently I installed a different engine in my Vic. When I was putting all the accessories back on it I installed the same distributor that had come off the previous engine. Since I had not disturbed the center screw I thought I was good to go; I wasn't!

The car would not even begin to start. When I checked the timing I found it was off by a country mile. How could that be? Everything should be the same; the cam and crank are in the same relationship to each other on all engines by virtue of lining up the marks on the cam and crank gears.

After giving it some thought, I realized where the culprit was. The little widget called the "oil pump distributor drive assembly" that is located in the valve chamber directly below the distributor has a little gear on the end that meshes with the gear in the center of the cam. When the widget is installed in an engine it is an arbitrary installation. Therefore a distributor has to have its timing set for a particular engine.

So, the next time you are on a tour and a fellow club member has trouble with his distributor don't think you can offer your previously timed distributor for his car and expect it to work. A distributor has to be timed to a particular car. ©
