



TECHNICAL 2009

March - April Technical Session

Aha, the end of March and the Pancake Breakfast will soon be history but, a word or two about the technical sessions can't hurt, right?

Impromptu Session

Ed Cote reported difficulty in starting his '31 Phaeton. The problem existed within the carburetor; specifically, blocked passageways and sticking float valve. A thorough cleaning of the carburetor components seemed to correct the problem. The problem source was/is contamination resulting from fuel evaporation residuals and rust formation over the years of non-use of the car. As a reminder; for extended periods of storage, the fuel system should be thoroughly drained. For shorter periods of storage the car should be run at least once a month.

March Technical Session

The morning of March 12 dawned and, as planned, we met at 8am at the IHOP in Placentia for breakfast and a review of the current events. Following breakfast we regrouped at the corner of Orangethorpe and Crowther Ave. in Placentia to commence the "speedometer versus gps" trial runs.

There were 6 Model A's and 9 individuals in attendance along with several gps units for use. The tests runs were made on a ¾ mile, straight, level City Street. Under these conditions the gps units are typically rated at +/- 0.1mph accuracy. The results of the test trials are shown in the table to the left. The column labeled "indicated speed" represents the speedometer reading. The column labeled "Ratzlaff IN OD" was collected with the overdrive unit engaged. The data in this column indicates the gps readings averaged 30% faster than the speedometer. This agrees well with the overdrive rating. As you can see from the table most gps readings were within 10% or less of the speedometer-indicated speed; not bad for a 70 year old device! Turns out, my speedometer was the worst of the bunch.



Wallichs Music City

Hollywood, California

Those of you who grew up in the Los Angeles area during the 1950's may remember Wallichs Music City on the northwest corner of Sunset and Vine in Hollywood. It was a huge music store that featured numerous private listening booths. The 45-RPM records had just been developed and you could go into Wallichs and request a song title and they would give you a record to take into a booth to listen to. As I recall Wallichs was open all night, or at least until the wee hours of the morning. It was a popular thing for teenagers to do late on a Friday or Saturday night.

The store was in business from 1940 to 1978 and was originally owned by Glenn Wallichs (1910-1971). The building was demolished in the early 1980's and replaced with a strip mall that was also later demolished. Today there is a condo building on the property with a Borders store on the bottom floor where Wallichs Music City once stood.

Another unique phenomenon of the early 1950's was a disk jockey calling himself Huggy Boy (Richard Hugg 1928-2006). Huggy broadcast his after-midnight show from the window of Dolphin's music store in Hollywood. His specialty was playing the little heard music of black artists, which soon became known as rhythm & blues.

Hollywood in those days was a colorful place of movie stars, make believe, and glitter. Today it is a blighted sad reminder of things that once were. ☺

Technical Clue (for those of us that are clueless)

Consider buying a modern car.....just kidding, there is no challenge in that! For this month's clue we need to go back to the July/August 1998 Restorer and the "Patent Cures" column. It reads as follows: When you add 600W lubricant to your transmission, fill only to the bottom thread in the filler hole. This is sufficiently high to thoroughly lubricate the transmission. If you add more than that, the oil level will be high enough to drain through the large ball bearings in the front and back of the transmission when the car is parked. With the car stopped, the two slingers on the ball bearings will not be operating to keep the oil in the transmission.

As an added note (not part of the column): if there is no oil leak, it may be due to a low or nonexistent level of oil.

Egad; is that possible?

Chips and kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron.


From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled, it carried out the hulls.

In the fall, the apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees.


When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old apron could dust in a matter of seconds.


