Notes From Your President Mark Schwing. . .

2009 President's Letter



One of my favorite Model A body styles is the rarest of all, the 140- A Model A Town Car. No, not the 160-B Town Sedan but Town Car. It is so rare that book "*The Ford Model A As Henry Built It*" by George DeAngelis did not include it until the second edition.

The Town Car was designed by Briggs in the summer of 1928 after a body style design by Le Baron and being sold by Briggs. Its deluxe appearance and appointments far exceed any other Model A body style. In December 1928, Ford placed a purchase order to have 2500 Model A Town Car bodies produced by Briggs Manufacturing Company with the first 1500 to be completed by April 1, 1929.

Ford branches were told of the car in December 1928 and the sales price would be \$1400 or more than double other Model A body styles. Approximately 90 bodies were completed by the end of 1928 and shipped to the branches for sale initially at Lincoln dealers. Hence came the nickname "Baby Lincoln" for the Town Car. Initial sales were dismal at best and in February 1929, sales expanded to select Ford dealerships.

Even with expanded dealerships offering the model and a price reduction to just \$1200, sales continued to be poor and in September 1929, Ford cancelled the contract with Briggs. 1143 had been delivered at that point and an additional 55 bodies were in process. Some of these were reworked as 1930 models with last Town Car delivered to Ford in February 1930 making a total of 1198 production cars. The Town Car design is quite unique with the driver or chauffeur's compartment upholstered in leather and separated form the passenger compartment by two fixed and one sliding glass window. The top of this compartment was removable leather and could be stowed under the chauffeur's seat. The interior of the passenger compartment was done in brown broadcloth and include two floor hassocks, a vanity set and a cigar lighter with ash tray. The style and the appearance of the upholstery look very formal.

If you have an opportunity to see on of these Town Cars in person, please take some time and look it over carefully. Many of the knobs and trims are unique to this model only. Our club had a chance to see one a few years ago in the General William Lyons collection. There were three at the recent Merriville, Indiana MARC meet with one on display indoors and the other two being driven.

Several years ago, *The Restorer* had an article on a collector who had a number of these unique cars. I can't recall the exact number but I believe it was five or six. I understand he has since passed away and the collection was separated.

Of the original 1198 cars produced, it is said that there are less than 20 still in existence. If you really interested trading your Model A sedan for the Town Car there is one for sale in Temecula that is reported to be in excellent, original, unrestored condition. The price? Oh, just a mere \$200,000. Or you could by a stable of 5 or 6 restored 160-B Town Sedans and build the stable to store them for under \$100,000. It is fun to dream.

July - August Technical Session

Didn't we just do this? Has a month passed already? In summary, heeeers what happened.

July Technical Session

The rumor was that some member's Model A's weren't performing up to expectations so; the goal of the July session was to look at the symptoms, diagnose the suspected cause and, if possible, fix it. So with that in mind we arranged to meet at Paul Steed's home the morning of July 25th. The weatherman promised to provide plenty of sunshine and temperatures into the high 90's and boy, did he deliver. Not to worry though, we had a shade awning! There was a good turnout of members present; maybe it was the hot weather or perhaps the donuts and coffee. I guess I would bet on the latter. Anyway, we managed to look at 3 model A's that were having problems ranging from timing, braking, carburetion, to clutch adjustments. Some of the activity is shown in the photos below. By the end of the morning a good bit of Model A stories had been traded, a few adjustments were made, all the donuts and coffee were consumed and 3 model A's left with "improved" performance. 
August Technical Session

There will not be any planned technical session for August------There are two other events scheduled to be enjoyed by the membership.

Technical Clue (for those of us that are clueless)

Recently we had the opportunity to drive our 1929 Tudor up to Buellton, CA for the "Wings and Wheels" event held at the Santa Ynez Airport; approximately 140 miles one-way. As you all know it isn't unusual to have your Model A get a little overheated on hot summer days and long uphill excursions. Well, our A is no exception and this worried us a bit so, we put together a little device that is the topic of this month's "clue". The idea was not invented here but rather implemented here. Wouldn't it be nice to have a simple method of spraying a water mist on your radiator so as to provide some additional evaporative cooling to combat those "Model A hot flashes" when they occur? To this end we purchased a simple 1 ¼ gal garden sprayer at harbor freight for \$10, placed it in the corner near the rear seat, ran a length of Tygon tubing from the sprayer on/off valve to the front of the radiator and attached the spray nozzle to the rock guard in front of the radiator (see photo). A gallon of distilled water, a couple pumps to pressurize the sprayer and a passenger to push the trigger provides an effective spray onto the radiator cooling tubes. The effect was readily observable since you could watch the Motometer temperature decrease.



The Famous Orange County Meets

Our famous Orange County Pancake Breakfast which has now been going on for 48 years was once put it on Spring AND Fall each year and included a gymkhana event after the breakfast on the top deck of the Union Bank parking structure on Main Street.

Keeping this in mind, we also put the famous Model A Roundup in the fall each year.

It began demurely as a small car show in 1963 at the old Santa Ana Community Center where the stadium is now. It was started by early club pioneers Harold and Tillie Jones and Les Scott.

The second roundup was an absolute coup in Model A circles. It was held at Knotts Berry Farm and included a drive through ghost town, free coupons for attendees, combined car and clothing judging with 50% car and 50% clothing. The grand finale trophy awards in the covered wagon circle awarded 5 place trophies in 5 classes plus a best club participation trophy.

The judging of cars consisted of a walk around, look under the hood, open the door and peek in and maybe a casual stoop to look under the fenders or running boards. The clothing judging brought a smile to everyone's faces. A costume may consist of a "boater" and bow tie, an era bathing suit, a three piece suit, or a complete formal outfit complete with top hats, furs, knickers for the kids, and sometimes costumes more appropriate for the 1890's.

With 25 trophies and such a generous judging attitude, big families with era clothing almost always walked away with a trophy. This was the meet that everyone couldn't miss and over a hundred Model A's participated way back in 1964.

These meets brought out the crowd's, the fun seekers and the attitude that brought all of us to the hobby. Walter Knott invariably made a showing in a golf cart and wore a grin as big as the rest of us. He kind of reminded me of Henry Ford.

As time progressed, the ghost town tour was discontinued for liability sake. Soon the park was fenced and admission charged, the coupons stopped, we moved across Beach Blvd and had our meet near Independence hall. By 1986 The meet had moved to the old Lion Country Safari in Irvine. It was planned as a great extravaganza and included pewter plates commemorating the meet with extravagant spending to attract the crowds that failed to appear and spend the money. It proved to be the last Roundup and is now but a memory in the hearts of old time SoCal Model A enthusiasts.






