April Technical Report: Elmo's Radiator Saga By John Knox

No one showed up to the March Technical but several weeks ago Gerry O'Brian and I went down to help Diana Stewart with Elmo's leaky radiator. Gerry thought that Diana had over filled it so we really did not need to take it off to have it fixed until we found out the exact problem. We drained some of the water down. Diana explained it did it mostly while going up hills. We took a test drive and it burped once and then was fine on the rest of the hills. We left wondering if we had really fixed it. She continued to drive it and it continued to leak a little and then stop.

On Saturday before the tour we were lined up and Diana was still saying that it leaked off and on around and seemed to be coming from the goose neck. As we were looking for an allen wrench to tighten the hold down bracket, Pete Hyland casually said, looks like you don't have a washer between the cap and the stem. I don't have one and mine does not leak so I was not sure.

On further inspection we noticed a lot of build up on gunk around between the cap and the stem. Others said "Yes you need a washer there if you do not have one." Well Pete was right! Diana wrote to us saying: "Pete you appear to have the solution. Bill and I took off the radiator cap today and as I cleaned off all the crud it became clear that there was no gasket/o-ring/ or seal of any type between the top of the radiator and the cap. It appears that grease was packed into the cavity as the seal. This clearly worked for quite awhile amazingly enough. Anyway, I found another cap laying around in my spare new parts and we used that. So now the radiator cap is tight against the radiator. I have ordered another set of radiator cap replacement parts from Snyder as a backup.

Thanks for all your help and hopefully this easy fix takes care of my problem, Diana"




Velma Riggs, Diana Stewart and Bill Douglas.

join us next time.







Technical Clue (For those of us that are clueless) (Don Ratzlaff)

Have you ever wondered how reliable those Model A

door latches are? Perhaps you have experienced a door opening unexpectedly when turning a corner?

Well, here is an idea that

might increase your confidence that the door will remain closed. This clue comes from our club member, Wayne Switzer. First, you must obtain a small compression spring, say about 3/4 inch in diameter consisting of approximately six coils of .020 to 030 diameter wire (see picture above). If you were to insert



the spring behind the door latch it will serve to insure a positive extension and engagement of the latch into the door post catch. The second picture illustrates the placement of the spring. Note, this

serves as a backup to that 80 year old spring that Henry Ford originally installed inside of your Model A door; a good idea.


