HISTORIANS CORNER

Dick Smith, Club Historian 8/2011

In this and the coming months ahead, the "Historians Corner" will honor many long time members and some past club officers, by inviting them to share their memories of their love of their Model A Ford. These members have all been a positive influence, which has made this club what it is today.

This month **Al Zannino** has written about his reflections of many years with his first Model A Ford.

Reflections on years past: by Al Zannino MY "A"

I moved into my current home in 1974. I saw this 1931 Model A Ford coupe across the street in a neighbor's garage with years of dust and cobwebs dulling its black paint. It had flat tires and the chrome bumpers were corroded green and rusty. I thought it was beautiful and got really excited. With a little work and elbow grease I could make this car a nice driver.

I have always loved old cars and once owned a 1938 Chevy PU and a 1936 Ford V8 dune buggy. I asked if the car was for sale and how much. The lady owner said \$10,000. Disappointed, I said "When you are serious about selling it, let me know".

I got to see the old Ford drive down the street backfiring, misfiring, smoking, and rattling a couple of times, whenever one of Louise's boyfriends would take an interest in the car. When I inquired about the car, about every three or four years, I received the same answer that I got the very first time. I replied with my same answer. Some years later Louise put her house up for sale and it sold quickly. I received the call I had been waiting for. She asked if I knew the value of the Ford. I told her I did not, but she could get an appraisal and we could start from there. She indicated she did not have the slightest idea where to get someone reputable to appraise it. I remembered there were two old Ford parts stores in Orange and suggested she check with them. Two guys from the local Model A club Dennis and Bob checked out the car, got it running again on 3 cylinders, and made an

offer. Louise told me she had a firm offer of \$3,500 and she wanted \$4,000.

I bought the Ford I had wanted for the past 12 years. I did not even know the starting procedure for a Model A. I went down to the old Ford parts store 8 miles away to buy an owner's manual only to find out they had moved to a new location 1.5 miles from my home. After reading the manual cover to cover I went to take my first drive in a Model A Ford. I only had to go from her garage across the street to my garage, but what a thrill.

I have now owned that coupe for 25 happy years and every time I get in and start her up, I still get that same thrill. I'm not sure what it is about driving a Model A, but I notice that the majority of people are friendlier and smile when they see it. Maybe it's because when the Model A's were made the world was a gentler place. Life seemed to be going at a slower pace, you could seal a deal with a handshake instead of a contract, a man's word was all you needed, and people were kinder to one another. Most people did not have a lot, but they thanked God for it, and even shared what they had. I think we all miss that time in America and seeing a Model A brings some of those thoughts back.

I often smile when some stranger comes up to me when I'm getting in or out of my old Ford and tells me their dad or grandfather had one just like mine, ...only it was a Chevysedan... that was green.... Well close enough. It's the good feeling they get when recalling those memories.

My Model A is not a show car; it's only a driver with lots and lots of miles on it. I thoroughly enjoy driving my A and I am glad other folks get some joy out of it too. Make your neighbors happy too by driving your old Model A Fords as often as you can.

Do you collect the MAFCA <u>Restorer</u> magazines? If so, I have many copies from the mid-70's to current, that was donated by our members to be shared with our Orange County Model A members at no cost. Just contact me with your issues desired. 


