<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Joe Goff presented the budget for the 2012 year to the membership. A motion was made by Tissy Hatcher and seconded by Ed Cote to approve the budget as presented.

HISTORIANS CORNER

In this and some coming months ahead, the "Historians Corner" will honor many long time members and some past club officers, by inviting them to share their memories of club life over the years. These members have all been a positive influence, which has made this club what it is today.

This month **Jeanne Parrish**, a <u>49</u> year member, and the current **club first lady**, has written about <u>her</u> reflections on years past, which are a compilation of past activities and social good times.

Remembering by Jeanne Parrish

We joined OCMAFC sometime in 1962. Debbie, was one year old, Brenda was due in January '63. Mark was not far behind in November '64 and we now had a problem with space for three babies in our 1931 Deluxe Coupe, which was very, very unrestored! We moved from our home in Fullerton to Garden Grove just as Mark arrived. The three little ones kept me busy but we still attended the Pomona swap meet with our good friends Jim & Bev Marsh who now had four kids of their own. The Pomona swap meet was then hardly as big as our swap meets, now at high schools.

The coupe had to go and Richard replaced it with a 1930 Tudor that he immediately turned into 10,000 pieces. He and Jim worked, on our new "car" and Jim's equally disassembled Roadster Pickup it seemed, forever. Our good friends Pat & Donna Peddicord had two beautifully restored Model A's, an A400 and a '31 Roadster. They let us drive, either car, any time we wanted. I wonder why our car restoration slowed down. We women started to take a more active part in the club. We shopped antique shops and swap meets for era clothing for the entire family. The Izaak Walton club house in Santa Ana was our meeting place. The decor of this old building were a variety of stuffed animal heads all over the walls. At Christmas time, you should have seen the antlers and horns of those "darn" animals, wreathed in paper chains and Christmas balls! John Heiland was always our Santa and the kids could never figure out who it was, until one recognized

his shoes. This continued until we ran out of kids and even grand kids. Part of the fun for them was playing on the adjacent golf course and getting chased off by the grounds keeper, "every month". Memories of those early years include activities such as yearly weekend campouts at ldyllwild, above Palm Springs, Artesian Lakes near Escondido, (where all our kids played in a small "mud lake"! What fun!), and weekends prior to Memorial Day in Santa Barbara (with "luxury" accommodations at the Motel 6! We loved it and the owners of the motel saved all their rags for us every year. You never saw a more car-polishing group!) Also, meets in Yuma, AZ, Rim of the World, Lake Arrowhead and New Year's Eve parties. Pot lucks and poker runs began and enjoyed by all.

The Orange Co Roundup was *The* best of the best meets. A combined score of judging car and family era clothing produced huge numbers of winners from near and far in numerous categories. Knott's Berry Farm was then without gates, walls or admittance fees. There was always a parade thru Ghost Town. We gathered near the Calico Saloon square and steam train. One of our most avid fans was none other than Mr. Walter Knott, always with a big smile on his face. The Covered Wagon Circle, with adequate seating on benches and

inside the wagons (kids loved this!) provided a perfect setting for our Awards Ceremony and the end of a perfect day with Model A friends and family. The roundup lasted about 23 years.

The Orange Co Pancake Breakfast, of course, has persisted 50 years. It was both a Spring and Fall event in Hart Park and was going strong each year right along side the Roundup. We originally cooked on large stone fireplaces with griddles and wood was our fuel. We cracked fresh eggs, cooked them to order (somewhat), sausage patties and fed "large crowds" of 50 or 60 people! We then had a gymkhana on the top level of the Union bank building in the afternoon.

One long, long weekend, the club rented a huge 3-level cabin in the mountains. There were bunk beds everywhere and it seemed the whole club attended. It rained very heavily all nightmaybe even a small hurricane! Roof leaked from top to bottom floor. It was wet, cold with no sleep! Ah, "Memories are Made of This"!

The most remembered ladies event was the great "Orange County Follies" of 1966 and "MAFCA Follies" of 1969. Orange County members were asked to provide entertainment for the National Banquet/Installation Dinners in the December months. Sandy Antonacci, was our director for both of these off-Broadway (very off!!) hit shows. We would do record pantomimes to hit songs of the 20's & 30's. Era clothing was worn and rehearsals were held for many weeks. There were solos, choruses, and the "dirty ole man" (Larry Boef) skit from "Laugh in". The show ended with many of our men performing "in drag" in a chorus line. The show was a great success and ended with standing ovations. (Featured in Jan. Feb. issues of the 1967 & 1970 Restorer Magazines)

Richard and I have traveled over a 100,000 miles in our Model A's and accumulated a million memories of almost 50 years in the Model A Ford Club. Our children grew up in them and we now enjoy traveling with children, as well as grandchildren on many of our trips.
