Tips from Rick Technical Advisor

Alternator Alignment

Many of us with "touring" Model "A's" have installed alternators for improved lighting, reliability and faster starting. There are many suppliers of kits for installing a Delco (GM) 6 volt or 12 volt alternator on a Model "A", but the kits do not insure proper alignment of the pulley with the water pump and crank shaft pulley. An alternator out of alignment can cause failure of the fan belt and bearings in the water pump and alternator.

I experienced this problem when I installed a 12 volt alternator in my Victoria. I noticed that the alignment was off a little, but figured that the belt would "adjust" for it. Within 300 miles, my new fan belt began to shred and I was getting occasional bearing squeal from the alternator. That's when I knew I had to do something!

Most alternator kits come with an "H" bracket to mount the unit to your front timing gear cover. One company offers an offset bracket, but it is expensive and may not provide the offset you need. An easy and free fix is to remove your alternator and turn it bottom side up. The bottom of the case has a hump which contains a tube that the mounting bolt goes through. You can easily cut off one end of the tube, depending on which way your unit needs to move to provide for proper alignment. Use a cut-off wheel or even a hack saw - case is aluminum and cuts easily. I cut off about 3/8" to put mine back in alignment. Save the piece you cut off and put it on the other end of the tube along with a thin washer. That way, your alternator will stay where it's supposed to when you reinstall it in the "H" bracket on your engine. This process worked perfectly on my car.

If you have not installed an alternator, but would like to, refer to Les Andrews' Model "A" Mechanics Handbook, Vol. II for complete instructions. If you would like to install it with a bunch of old guys eating donuts and offering suggestions, call me and I will set up a technical seminar.

I know of a source for an alternator kit with a lifetime warranty for less the \$100. If you go with a 12 volt system, you'll also need a 12 volt battery, coil and new 12 v light bulbs. No new wiring is required. This is an easily installed improvement!

THE JOURNEY By Jerry Neat (with encouragement from Patti)

It's been a long journey, but I'll condense to just a few paragraphs.

Sometime in 1930, my great-grandfather, Willis S. Harris, decided to buy a new car. Ford was the obvious choice, and a Fordor Town Sedan with a Murray body looked pretty good, so he bought the contraption.

Fast forward to the early fifties. My great-grandparents lived in a very nice area called Willowbrook, near Watts. My folks would take me and my brother over to visit every couple of months. We'd play cowboys on wooden sawhorses and chase the chickens around the yard. Eventually, Great Grandpa would grab a chicken and wring its neck, and we'd have fried chicken for dinner. While dinner was cooking, my brother and I would sneak out to the garage and run our toy cars on the fender of the "A" down to the running board. We'd get caught, get yelled at a little, then go inside for dinner.

Both my great grandparents passed away in the mid-fifties. They had three children: Willis, Charlie and Mildred, my grandmother. When my dad was helping clean out the house and settle the estate, he asked the brothers what they were going to do with the "A". At that time, Model A's were a dime a dozen, and they told my dad they didn't want the darn thing. So they sold it to him for \$45.00. I remember going with my dad to pick up the car. Our neighbor went with us and towed the "A" home with nothing more than a sturdy chain. It was fun riding in the car while my dad steered the dead weight back to Whittier.

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The car sat in our garage for a few years, and my dad finally got it running when we were in high school. So we wound up driving it to school every day, until my brother took it to college in Santa Barbara for a year or two. Then he got married and moved to Chicago, and I got married a year later. My dad passed away in 1972, and my mom kept the car registered until 1978, but never drove it.

About that time, I told my mom I'd like to restore it, so I towed it over to my house and put it in the garage. It went with me through three houses and one divorce. Life just happened, and I never had the time or money to do anything to it. So there it sat, collecting lots of dust. Every couple of years I'd push it out of the garage, wash it and think, "I'd sure like to drive this again." It continued to sleep in the garage.

When Patti and I got married in 1996, she thought it was a pretty neat car. That's as far as we got. Then, when I retired in May of this year, Patti said "Get it running! Just do it!" When I reached the end of my budget, she sounded like a Nike commercial: "Just do it!"

With her encouragement and support I started looking into it. Then we joined OCMAFC, and the fire was lit. I started spending money like a drunk sailor, and managed to convince Richard Parrish to come over a few times and assist with his pretty impressive knowledge of the "A" and skills in putting the darn thing back together. I started working on it in July of 2011, got so many cuts and scrapes I felt like I was going to bleed to death before I got it running. I drove it out of the garage for the first time in over 40 years on December 21, 2011. Richard was at my house for the historic (or in my case, hysterical) moment, and my wife shot a short video. It may not be pretty right now, but beautification will come in the future. For now, I'm thrilled to be driving it for the first time since I was 17 years old.



For me, this has truly been a labor of love.
