# Tips from Rick Technical Advisor

# Engine Overheating Issues By Rick Hall, Technical Director

Most of us with Model "A's" intended for touring have replaced the original Ford radiator with a newer reproduction radiator or a re-cored radiator because the old one was plugged up or leaked too much. The newer radiators are much more efficient because they have smaller diameter tubes which hold the water in the radiator longer and thereby dissipate more heat. This can be a problem, however, because the radiator cannot handle the flow rate of the water pump. Consequently, water "piles up" in the upper radiator tank, and with nowhere else to go, it flows out the overflow tube. It won't be long until you are low on water and your engine overheats.

To remedy this problem, you must reduce the flow of water from the pump to the radiator. There are two good and inexpensive ways to do this. The first is to put a flow restrictor in the top radiator hose in the form of a thermostat. I prefer the 160 degree model and these are available from most Model "A" parts house for under \$25 and are easily installed. Warm-up time is reduced, which is a nice side benefit for your engine. The second method is to remove your water pump and grind off about 1/3 of each of the impeller blades. This can be done easily with an angle grinder or with a file (which is a lot more work).

Both flow reduction methods can be used together suc-



cessfully. If these changes do not solve your water loss problem you may need to have your radiator checked, cleaned or re-cored. Call me if you need this service and I can refer you to a local shop that does good work at reasonable prices. In some cases, your engine may be creating the cooling problem if the timing is off, there is a cracked block, blown head gasket or plugged water passages.

# More Tips from Rick Technical Advisor

# Safety Tip Keep those Lug Nuts Tight!

Before you motor off to your next tour, tighten those lug nuts! They should have about 65 lbs. of torque on them. If you don't have a torque wrench, use a socket with a breaker bar that's 15 inches long and give it a good strong tug. Don't use a ratchet or your Model "A" crank - they aren't long enough.

If you have lug nuts that don't turn on easily, the threads are probably stretched or cross threaded. You can use a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch NF20 die on the bolts and a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch NF20 tap on the nuts to clean them up. If you do this, make sure they will hold the 65 lbs of torque. If they don't, replacement will be necessary.

Never lubricate lug nuts. Clean them with lacquer thinner if there is any trace of oil.

Want to keep those shiny new lug nuts looking pretty? Use a 13/16 inch socket with a 6 inch extension and a breaker bar or torque wrench. The old Model "A" crank socket is too large and will round off the corners of the nuts. Use a plastic grocery bag over the wrench to protect the cad plating. Wrap the bag around the extension and it will keep you from chipping the paint on your spokes!



The architect working on the details of the Model A museum design is scheduled to complete his work in mid-February. Design details such as the brick style and the amount of insulation are being decided, one by one. The location of the engraved bricks will be decided soon. The goal is to sell 500 more bricks so that additional clubs and individual Model A'ers will be permanently recorded at the museum. That number of bricks will raise the additional money needed to build and outfit the museum, and will help assure its future. The Museum fund is now at the \$850,000 level as the result of a few recent large donations on top of many smaller donations over the years. That is almost enough to build the building, but an additional amount is still needed in case there are unforeseen problems during construction and to pay for expenses related to moving into the building and setting up the displays. So buy a brick this month and live forever at the Model A Ford Museum.

### **HISTORIANS CORNER**

Dick Smith, Club Historian 02/2011

In this and <u>some</u> coming months ahead, the **"Historians Corner"** will feature interesting articles from the past. This month I chose an article previously published in the "Distributor" vol. 44 # 12 December 2004. Some slight modifications were made.

#### WHO OR WHAT IS A MODEL A

This is not your usual technical article. I thought I would take a shot at describing who we are and what we are all about. I've been a member of MAFCA and another club for about five years, so these are the observations of a relative novice.

I've found one common denominator among all the members I've had contact with. They love their cars! They love to talk about them, look at other people's cars, work on and repair them, dress them up with accessories and modify them.

Model A'ers seem to fall into some discreet categories but none of them are exclusive.

The Purist—These people like their cars "the way Henry built them". No 12 volt electrical systems, no hydraulic brakes, no sealed beam headlights, etc. Given a choice most of them would really like to have them in original condition, including paint and upholstery. Since those cars are quite rare, they will settle for restoration to the original configuration, using as few reproduction parts as possible. They good-naturedly look down their noses at those with "modified" cars.

**The Modifiers**—These folks want their cars to appear original but may convert to 12-volt negative ground systems, which makes it more convenient to add some electrical accessories and allow the use of alternators, which provides a more reliable method of maintaining your battery. They may change to 15 or 16-inch modern tubeless tires and rims to provide a softer ride. They convert to modern head and tail lights for better nighttime visibility. They add safety items such as seat belts and safety glass. Mainly they stick with improvements of which they think Henry Ford would approve.

The "Hot-Rodders"—These guys really want to impove performance on the road. They want to travel attoday's highway speeds and to run smoother and quieter than a stock Model A. Their modifications run the gamut from simply adding a high compression head to a fully modified, high performance '4-banger' with pressurized oil and cooling systems, inserted main bearings, performance cams, maybe even a 'Riley 4-port' or multiple carburetion. The sky's the limit for these guys. And you'd better have fairly deep pockets to join this group. They enjoy hill climb competitions and long distance tours. They can talk for hours about modifications to the functional parts of the Model A. AND...they are the first ones on the scene when your hood goes up on the road somewhere! The "Socializers"---These are your average, fun loving, MAFCA members. They love their cars and want them to run well, but they don't particularly want to work on them. They enjoy the tours (especially the shorter one, 40-100 miles) and the occasional seminar. They enjoy the company of other Model A'ers as well as the events such as picnics, community, car shows, museum visits, etc. they socialize with each other outside of Club activities and are probably the majority of MAFCA members. They keep their cars clean and shined and enjoy the attention a well-turned-out Model A brings to all of us.

I'm sure that each reader can think of their own group designations but the key thing is, all of them are fun. You can feel free to be part of more than one group or to move from one to the other when your interest or financial situation makes it appropriate. The main thing is, **these are my kind of people**, with old fashioned values of courtesy, thoughtfulness, respect and willingness to offer a helping hand at almost every opportunity. Above all, they have a love for a basic all-American car, which was only manufactured for 4 years beginning 84 years ago! The Model A Ford.
