# Tech Tips from Rick Rick Hall, Technical Advisor

## More on the Distributor/Ignition System

Last month, Tom Endy wrote a great article, "Henry's Way" about the advantages of the original Model "A:" distributor. Here are three additional suggestions to keep your ignition system running well:

1) When you attach your ignition cable to the distributor, turn it in 2-3 complete turns, not until it stops. The top of the cable is spring loaded and just needs to make good contact with the indent in the lower plate. If you turn it in too far, it can bend the tab in the lower plate and ground it. This will short out your ignition and blow your fuse.



2) Most of us pay close attention to keeping the points set to the proper gap (0.018-0.022") but just as important is the gap between the rotor tip and the four contact points. The gap should be 0.025". Some restorers like as much as 0.035" for better high speed performance. The point is the gap needs to be even all the way around, somewhere between 0.025" and 0.035". The rotor needs to be parallel to the contacts. Be careful about bending it. Better to raise it with thin shims glued to inside of the rotor body, or lower it by grinding the dome of the cam set screw.



3) Check to make sure your coil polarity is correct. If it's not, your coil will work much harder (and possibly fail) and your spark will be much weaker, causing poor performance, hard starting and missing. Nu-Rex makes a handy tester (available from Model A parts stores for about \$25.)



Remember, a complete spare distributor, timed to your engine is a great way to get back on the road quickly should any element of your distributor fail.

# **Determining the Age of a Tire**

How old is that new tire you're planning on buying? Just because it has never been put on a car, and looks new, doesn't mean that it IS new. There is a very simple way to determine when a tire was made. Look on the edge of the tire where the size and manufacturer name are displayed. There is a series of numbers and letters following the letters "DOT' (Department of Transportation). The last three, or four, numbers indicate when the tire was made. The first two numbers are always the week; e.g., 03 is the 3rd week, 45 is the 45th week. The last, or last two numbers indicate the year; e.g., 7 is 1997, 09 is 2009. Therefore, 2710 means that tire was made in the 27th week of 2010.

Many tire manufacturers recommend not using tires that are over six years old, because the rubber starts drying out and cracking. Other tire manufacturers say ten years old.




## Orange County Club Scholarship
