and family activities - all take time (and money).



Tour of the Stanley Ranch Museum — January 11th

The January tour will be on Saturday the 11th. We will meet at the Panera Bread at 2214 North Tustin Street at 9am and then leave at 9:30am to drive surface streets to the Stanley Ranch Museum, 12174 Euclid Street, Garden Grove, by 10am. There will be a \$5.00 fee for each adult and\$1.00 for children. Lunch location will be decided by the time of the tour.



The Ware-Stanley House, completed in 1892, is the focus home at the museum. Also included at the site are homes dating from the late 1800's to the early 1900's. Garden Grove's first post office, opened in 1877; the Electric Shoe Shop/Barber Shop; and Garden Grove's #1 fire engine, a 1926 American La France, are part of the exhibits. One of the most popular attractions is the Walt Disney Studio Garage which was relocated to the former ranch site in the 1980's.

Everyone had a fantastic time. Lots of camaraderie, laughter and sharing of stories. If you missed this event, please try to attend future club activities. You will not be disappointed.







Technical Tips—Brake Adjusting Shaft—A Critical Measurement By Rick Hall



A ave you ever had the experience of putting new brakes on your Model A and having one brake dragging, and yet you have to adjust it up to make the car stop evenly? The culprit could be uneven brake adjusting

shafts. This situation will cause one shoe to drag, and the other not to touch at all. It is essential that both shafts on each wheel be of equal length. Yet, these little devils are very difficult to measure, due to all the angles.

I made a tool from $\frac{3}{4}$ " steel strap, a brake pin and a wing nut and screw that does a nice job of measuring the length and angle of the pin. I tack welded the pin and screw to the strap, but an epoxy glue would also work.



New adjusting shafts are available for under \$5 each (8 needed per car), but there is no guarantee that they are perfectly equal. If your old ones are in reasonable condition, they can be ground with a file or grinding wheel to equal length and angle.

If your brake shoes have been on you car for some time and you are not replacing them, your shoes have probably worn in (unevenly) to compensate for unequal adjusting shafts. The procedure I have described should be used with new or lightly worn shoes.




