

Technical Tips— Restoration

A recent upgrade to cast iron drums on the roadster led me to removing the bearings from the old rear drums to put them in the new ones. If you have original bearings (the ones with spiral grooves in the rollers) reuse them as they are usually better than the reproduction ones without the grooves. Just check to make sure they are not pitted or otherwise damaged.

The problem in removing the bearings from the old drums is that the grease seals that hold them in can be very difficult to remove. There are two good methods for removing the seals. The first requires using a large drift or cut off axle shaft as a base for a pry bar to pry out the seal. My drift is 7" long, 15/16"

around and tapered at one end.

The other method is by using a 3/8" threaded rod about one foot long. Thread on a nut exposing about ½" of thread, then place a thick washer, then another nut. From inside the drum, push the rod through the drum to the outside. Push the bearing away from seal exposing a space of about 1/16". Place the washer into this space and strike the end of the rod with a hammer. You will need to work the washer all the way around the seal, striking multiple times to finally knock out the seal. I wrapped the threads with a piece of duct tape to prevent damage to the surface that mates with the axle.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to delicious refreshments furnished by Patti Cote, Esther Goff and Carolyn Ratzlaff.






