Next Tour — Rancho Los Alamitos — February 15th

Our tour will begin at 1pm on February 15th. We will have brunch somewhere along the way. More info on that at the February general meeting.

Rancho Los Alamitos is twice listed on the National Register of Historic Places - once as the sacred Tongva village of Povuu'ngna, the traditional birthplace of the native people of the Los Angeles Basin and, second, for the evolution of its significant historic landscape over time. The site includes traces of the ancestral village, an adobe-core ranch house ca. 1800, four acres of lush historic gardens developed during the 1920s and 30s, and the restored working ranch barnyard of the early-mid 20th century. With the opening of the Rancho Center, the film, new exhibits and room environments feature the landscape, the people and the place over time and within the context of the development of the region and the state.



This exceptional site reveals the early Tongva presence, the Spanish and Mexican periods, the ranching and farming era, and the imprint of 20th century development. A quintessential place for people to experience the living story of southern California, Rancho Los Alamitos is a microcosm of the region, past to present.

Ford Model A History

lub members and enthusiasts all know the Model A Ford as a series of cars built by the Ford Motor Company from 1928 through 1931. Digging a little deeper we understand that the cars were actually produced from November 1927 through March 1932. So by adding the fact that Model A's were produced a "little earlier" and a "little later" than initially reported we can wrap up the production history of the Model A Ford... or can we?

Henry Ford's first car was his "Quadracycle" built in 1896. Ford tinkered with other designs including racing variants until finally convincing investors to throw in with him and establish the Ford Motor Company in 1903. Anxious to produce and sell cars, the company developed the Model A. They produced about 1,750 of these cars which were powered by a two cylinder, eight horsepower engine using a chain drive to push the car down the road at a very respectable top speed of 45mph.

In my mind the original Model A was the inspiration for the "motorcar" Thaddeus Toad traded "Toad Hall" for in Disney's adaptation of "The Wind in the Willows"... but I could be wrong.

So with that being said, we now have the "full" picture of the Ford Model A production story. Or do we?



In April 1917 the United States of America declared war on Germany opening up our involvement in WWI. Shortly thereafter the Aircraft Production Board commissioned the creation of a new aircraft engine to bring America into the modern age of combat aircraft. It took just two months from inception to the first prototype of the Liberty 12 aircraft engine. Of course the Ford Motor Company played a major role in the effort producing ALL of the cylinders used in the new engines and 3,950 complete engines. Thus Ford was instrumental in helping win the war. So, what designation inconspicuously shows up on the nameplate used by Ford? You guessed it!


