How I Became A Model A'er (Part 1)

My name is Ken Blankshain. I'm brand new to the club and brand new to Model A's. I was born in Long Beach, grew up in Westminster across the street from my childhood sweetheart and wonderful wife: Lesie. We have four children from oldest to youngest: Zach - 24, Hannah - 22, Luke -19, and Esther - 16. I feel like I blinked and they were grown up. I'm sure you know the feeling. I'll be 55 in November and bought myself an early birthday present: a 1929 Murray Town Sedan.

A little over a month ago, the thought of a Model A had not entered my mind. I was at Bolsa Chica State Beach on a Saturday, because my youngest son Luke was playing keyboard in a band for a church outreach. As part of the event, the OC Model A Club had some cars there and I met Jerry & Patti Neat. Lesie and I must have talked with them for nearly an hour and I fell in love with his story: His great grandfather had bought this car new (a 1930 Murray Town Sedan); Jerry had restored it and was planning to give it to his grandson. He told us about the different years and kinds of Model A's.

Technical

Uh oh... my battery is just about dead!

Ever jumped into your car, turned the engine over only to hear it slowly chug? You instantly realize that the battery is low and most likely isn't going to start. Of course you pull out every trick you can think of like making sure the lights are off, you aren't flooding the carburetor, etc, then you sort of sneak up on it and quickly turn the key hoping that last bit of charge will be enough to start her up.

Sadly in the scenario above there is one small problem, the "little bit of juice" left is being severely depleted simply by using the starter to turn over the engine.

Luckily for "Model A'ers", we have another method of starting the car that we often over look. Instead of using up the last bit of juice in the battery to turn the starter motor we can use the hand crank!

Here is a procedure list for safely hand cranking your Model A:

- 1, Set the emergency brake and make sure the transmission is in "Neutral"
- 2. Retard the spark by raising the left (spark) lever to the top of its quadrant
- 3. Lower the throttle lever approximately three notches, or until the gas pedal lowers very slightly
- 4. Adjust the mixture on the dash to the setting appropriate for the conditions
- 5. With the ignition OFF, hold the choke out (fully closed). This will require either a helper, a pull cord from the lever on the carburetor to the front of the vehicle, or one of those modern undersized and sticky choke rod grommets
- 6. Carefully position the crank in place engaging the ratchet with the crank left of center in the lower of the two possible positions. Grasp the crank as shown in the photo above, paying close attention to the thumb position below the handle. Pull the crank to the top briskly but carefully
- 7. Repeat with a second pull
- 8. At this point there should be gas running slightly from the carburetor to the floor
- 9. Release the choke and turn ON the ignition
- 10. One more pull of the crank and the engine should start. NEVER push the crank down the right side of the rotation with the key on!
- 11. Advance the spark lever about half way down the quadrant and adjust the throttle speed.

Other considerations: Although there is no serious risk of injury when handling the crank as shown, it's startling when a kickback occurs. Most kickbacks occur when the choke is closed. The probability varies depending on the position of the crank ratchet relative to top dead center. Leaving the switch off during the choking step almost eliminates the chance of kickbacks.


With a low battery the engine will fire more quickly by hand than with the starter because the starter isn't starving the ignition system.

Variations: The car should start similar by hand as it does with the starter. For example, using the starter I always start my cold A's with the choke pulled for exactly two compression strokes or one turn of the crankshaft. At that point I release the choke and the engine fires. I NEVER hold the choke until it fires as suggested in the "Model 'A' Instruction Book".

If your car REQUIRES the choke to be held more than two compression strokes with the starter, you may need to adjust step #6 similarly.

Experiment with a good battery so if you have difficulty starting, you can use the starter to determine if the problem is too much or too little gas. Be conservative with the choke. It is much easier to repeat the process than to hand start a flooded engine. A flooded engine is guaranteed to provide more exercise than you desire!

What You Missed—Point Fermin Lighthouse

October 11th the Club meandered the byways of the streets of Los Angeles to our tour destination, The Point Fermin Lighthouse in San Pedro. We gathered at Cocoa's in Fountain Valley and we had eleven Model



"A"s and no moderns which was unusual. Frank did his best to see that our "scenic route" hit the best and the worst of the city communities and going over the Vincent Thomas Bridge was truly a highlight. The views of the harbor are awesome with the cruise lines in port.


The Lighthouse was built in 1874. The architecture was designed in Stick Style Victorian. There were six such designed lighthouses of which three are still standing. It has gabled roofs and horizontal siding. The employees were federal "Keepers: and the first Keepers were two sisters. Later families moved in. December 7, 1941 the lights went dark after the Pearl Harbor attach, never to be lit again. The style is not what you typically expect of a lighthouse, a tall cylindrical object. It appears more like a home. Restoration took place and the Lighhouse was open to the public in 2003. It's listed on the National Historic Register. All of us walked the many narrow stairs to the top where the beacon, the huge Fersnel Lens one stood. It is on display in the foyer and stands about five feet tall and a circumference of

about three feet. The whole glass lens is faceted. Just an awesome sight!

If your hand crank binds when inserted through the starting crank bushing and into the crank ratchet, don't crank start your car. Too much bind will prevent the crank from releasing from the ratchet. See Front Engine Support for more information.


