


President's Message



Legislative Corner

There are two pieces of legislation we must keep our eyes on that threaten the auto hobby and driving in general!

1) SB1183 is a bill that would allow a city, county, or regional park district to impose, as a bicycle tax, a local motor vehicle registration surcharge, in whole dollars not to exceed five dollars (\$5) on each vehicle registered. The ACCC has initiated a letter writing campaign in <u>opposition to SB1183</u>. This is a good one to write your Assembly member a letter over.

2) The ACCC has indicated that it <u>supports AB69</u>, a bill which was introduced to delay SB1079. SB 1079 is the fuel and gas tax hidden inside of the clean air bill AB32. SB 1079 will increase gas taxes January 1, 2015 by between \$0.16 and \$0.76 PER GALLON of gasoline and diesel. New taxes imposed for a typical Model A could cost up to an EXTRA \$7.60 to fill up based on SB1079!!! This bill (SB1079) must be stopped as it will hurt vulnerable Californians and place burden on all Californians at the pump as well as any goods that are shipped.

There is good news to report regarding the Legacy License Plate program—the program for Black with gold lettering plates (1963-1969 series) has exceeded the required 8100 orders and will go into production. If you own a car of that vintage and would like period style license plates, you can order them. The yellow/black lettering and blue/gold lettering plates thus far have fallen well short of the orders needed and appears will not be approved. Go to the DMV website to order plates at <u>http://www.dmv.ca.gov/legacyplates/index.htm</u>. This program does not replace the Year Of Manufacturer program if you have old plates you would like to use.
