Mystery Person—Do You Recognize Me?

This month's Mystery Person was born in 1932 and raised in St. Louis, Missouri, the youngest of three boys. Fun times were going to his grandfather's club house on the Meramec River with all his aunts, uncles, and cousins: swimming, playing volleyball, ping pong, chess, horse shoes, baseball, you name it. He and his middle brother were what you might call rowdy young boys who loved to have fun and frequently got into trouble, but never into any "real" trouble. They loved to tease their grandfather. took it upon herself to do the asking for her. He was smitten, and at the age of 20, he married his high school sweetheart in the little church they attended. They have three children, a girl and two boys. They moved to Gardena and became active in the church there, joining the Young Marrieds class. He chaperoned the youth group on outings and also served as an usher, deacon, and finance officer. They had great times with their church family going to parties, family camp, and picnics.

While raising a family of three, he worked at Sprague Engineering as a mechanic, assembling ground support equip-



ment for the aerospace industry. He attended night classes at El Camino Jr. College, and Long Beach State. With three small children in the home, he found it best to do his studying in their camping trailer in the evenings and weekends, eventually becoming an Electro/Mechanical Engineer. He left Sprague and started working for Garrett AiResearch (later known as AlliedSignal). As a Special Test Equipment Engineer, he worked on the BART and APALO programs, including life support equipment for aircraft and space, which required a secret clearance.

They have kept in touch with several couples they've known since school days: partying, playing cards, camping, gathering together on holidays; but lately, it's mostly been just getting together and discussing politics and their health.

He is now retired and has 7 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren. He loves his God, his family, and his country...and he loves to talk. Just don't get him started on politics. . . (Answer on Page 6)

The pile of parts was coming together with many members working on it. The camaraderie helped John through his grief and depression but it was taking a toll on him. We were worried. The best we could do was to be there, His friend.

Time, they say, heals all wounds and in time John improved and The pile of parts became *The car named Alice*.

Alice had always been very active in Laguna causes. The city named a low income housing project in her memory, Alice's Garden.

He threw a great party for the group each year. After eating we would all sit on his deck and watch the sun sink into the Pacific on it's way to the Hawaii.



John's health problems gave him a lot of pain. He took medicine but worked through these things and continued each year with his family and his Model A family.

I've never met anyone who visited Heaven and reported back. I wouldn't enjoy sitting on clouds and strumming a harp so I have an interesting theory, I think the good people in heaven might be just be allowed occasional visits to share some of the fun they had on earth with their earthly friends. On the tour to San Antonio Winery, were John & Alice riding along in *your* back seat, ours, enjoying a beautiful day and memories of past trips with us?

Perhaps John recalled Sally Fields famous remark at the Academy Awards.

Did he say? Alice I told you, "They like us" They really like us.

We will miss you and Alice John, together, and in our memory forever.

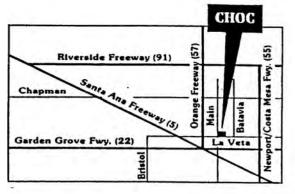
