



Carburetor Jetssss

In a galaxy far, far away... (opps). O.K., Once upon a time there was a... (opps). O.K., In the beginning... (opps, sorry). One more time... At some point in time many years ago, I had read an article concerning Zenith carburetor problems. Well, this article had to do with testing of jets. I had actually written an article for *The Distributor* with an open question as to the source of the information until recently. With great diligence, called sheer luck, I found the original article. It was *Carburetor Orifices Test* by Al Blatter of Southfield, Michigan and was published in the January/February 1983 *Model A Times*. Now, with all of that out of the way here is what I found and the abbreviated information from the article.

Henry had jets tested for correct flow using a pressured head of 36 inches of water being applied through the jet. Water was used for this testing because it was cheap, and had the same flow characteristics of gasoline. A simple devise can be built to test your own jets. I modified the one described in the article to use PVC pipe and connections. Using the unit to test many jets, I have found huge ranges from extremely rich to extremely lean on both original and reproduction jets. By correcting the jets to the correct size, then retesting for flow, I have had no problems with the carburetors I have rebuilt. Orifice size can be checked using either Paul Moller's book or Les Andrews' book. I personally prefer using the drills in the Les Andrews book. You can also check the stream of water passing through the jet to make sure it is solid and consistent.

The actual test device is shown on the next page. To use it, attach a hose to the connector at the bottom of the testing unit. Press the jet to be tested into the plastic tubing. Turn the hose on

very slowly, until a slow steady stream of water is running out of the top of the wedge. At this point, there should be a steady stream of- water coming out of the jet orifice. If the jet is partially clogged or burred, the jet stream will not be solid and consistent. Now take your waterproof watch with a second hand and a calibrated measuring container and measure the total flow for one minute. (Measuring units can be found at large camera supply stores and scientific/medical supply stores.)

Compare your results to the chart. If it is too lean, use the correct drill to open the jet orifice. If too rich, place a .020 stainless wire through the orifice and solder the orifice opening. The solder will not stick to the

stainless wire and it will provide an opening for the drill. Remove the wire and drill to the correct size. Retest. (Continued page 7)

We started our annual Poker Run from Panera Bread in Orange. There were 35 participants, 9 model "A"s and Bev with her cool T-Bird!!


The scenery we passed was lovely and truly enjoyable. There were a couple of missed turns but we all ended up together. We did not let that dampen the fun we were having.

To my Model A Friends, there are many current legislative issues that are under consideration or that were previously mentioned in the distributor. Below is a status update on these issues based on a recent ACCC newsletter article. For even more up to date info, Google is your easiest bet or visit www.acccdefender.org.

AB210	Vetoed	Watch	High occupancy vehicle lanes LA County. Any new lanes would require an hours of use requirement.	
AB550	Dead	Support	Smog check exemption fee. Would allow paying a \$200 abatement fee in lieu of passing if vehicle meets specified criteria	
AB932	2-Year	Watch	Specialized license plates for professional sports teams.	
AB1591		Watch	Transportation funding: would raise license fees by \$38 per vehicle; increase fuel taxes by \$0.225 per gallon; and increase the VLF on electric cars to \$160.


