ACCC UPDATE

Time for another ACCC update! What is the ACCC? Seems someone recently posted that question...plus or minus a few C's. ACCC stands for the Association of California Car Clubs. This association is a volunteer organization where regional representatives promote the interests of automobile hobbyists throughout the state who are interested in California laws and policies regarding collector automobiles. The objective is to protect the hobby and keep hobbyists informed of the latest issues affecting our clubs and cars.

What is new with the ACCC? Well I am sure you will be surprised to hear that gas taxes are still a problem. Apparently, there is an effort to file some legal action to show that the ballot language and title written by Attorney General Xavier Becerra was intentional attempt to deceive and confuse the citizens as the cast their ballots. The hope is to get this issue back on the ballot for 2020.

In other news, Collector Car Appreciation Day is July 12, 2019. No, this is not a new Hallmark invented holiday so they can sell more cards. This day is set aside each year to raise awareness of the vital role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society. This could be a good opportunity to get out for a drive and enjoy your car.

The last bit to share: There has been some confusion regarding the law regarding Planned Non-Operation (PNO), Vehicle Code Section 4604(d)3. The statue reads:

VC Sec 4604(d)3 exempts vehicles 25 years and older and other collectible vehicles of historic interest from the planned non-operation (PNO) requirements. Due to those vehicles being exempt and not being required to get a PNO past years fees and penalties are not due on vehicles that were not originally put onto a PNO.

So, if you are looking at purchasing a car older than 25 years that has not been registered, this should remove one barrier to the purchase. If you are dusting off a 25+ year old car that has been sitting in the garage for a while, again, there shouldn't be a penalty. (Cont'd on Page 4)

Recently I noticed my tires were wearing unevenly so I decided to rotate them as we all should do to get better life from them. It seems the fenders have a way of getting finger prints and smudges every time I get near my Model A. So I came up with this idea to hold protectors on the front fenders. I gathered up a bunch of old plastic pant hangers and cut the clips off from the ends. A hacksaw works well and I sand the rough edges from the clips.





Moving along I scrounged up an old inner tube I've been using for various uses. I cut 10 pieces for both wheels with the center cut out to slip over the lug nuts9+9, they don't have to be perfect just enough to keep the lug wrench from touching the wheel and chipping the paint off. I also put some shrink tubing on the end of my lug wrench just in case I accidently bump a spoke. You can substitute the shrink tubing with a piece of hose taped over the end.

Don't forget to check the tire pressure in all 5 tires. When I'm finished it all goes in a bag under the rear seat.
