Jim's Tech Tip

Installing the Horn Rod

When installing the small C-clip on the end of the horn rod, use an old wooden yardstick or something similar up at the steering wheel end to hold the horn button down. Slip the yardstick under the wheel on one side, go over the horn button, then gently flex the yardstick and slip the end under the steering wheel on the opposite side. The yardstick will hold the rod down while you work at the other end, pushing up on the spider against the spring, and inserting the C-clip keeper.

### ACCC Update

More gas tax woes...about the time you read this, you will be paying more taxes for your California gasoline. SBI enacted last year led to a \$0.12 per gallon increase then and will hit us with another \$0.07 per gallon on July I, 2019. The excise tax will increase from 41.7 cents a gallon to 47.3, an increase of 5.6 cents per gallon. If my math is correct we will be paying a total of 86 cents per gallon in state and federal taxes! Imagine, buy I0 gallons for your Model A to fill up and spend \$8.60 just on the tax—ouch.

The fossil fuel vehicle is certainly under attack. Another proposed law, SB44, would phase out diesel trucks in California. The bill, introduced by Senator Nancy Skinner, D-Berkeley, would require a 40 percent reduction in diesel emissions by 2030 (just over 10 years) and 80 percent by 2050. This would require a major overhaul of the trucking industry and some massive innovations in battery technology. Heavy and medium duty trucks

and busses currently make up 7 percent of the vehicles on California's roads.

In addition to SB44, SB246 is a bill that imposes an oil and gas severance tax upon any operator for the privilege of severing oil or gas from the earth or water in this State at specified rates. Of course, owner operators will pass the cost on to consumers. Estimates are it could be 10 cents per gallon if this passes.

Meanwhile, I silently consider what an electric Model A would be like. No Model A sounds, no Model A smells, supercar horsepower, nah—just give me the gas version Henry built.

Do you remember the 1929 1-1/2 ton Model A pickup truck with single rear wheels that had a starring role in "The Waltons" from 1972-1981?


