

Fuel Trouble on the Road August 2015

The Model A Restorers Club Saramana Region

This write-up is intended to help the Model "A" operator whose car has stopped on the road. Or is suddenly not running smoothly.

For this write-up we will assume that you have done a quick check to determine spark is reaching the spark plugs.

Quick Fuel Check---The first obvious things to check are the fuel gage and the glass filter bowl in the engine compartment.

We know the gas is turned on because you were running when it quit.

So far so good – now check for fuel flow to the carburetor.

At the bottom of the carburetor is a 1/2 inch hex head fitting that accesses the fuel to various jets in the bottom of the carburetor including the main jet (the hex closest to the air intake). Loosen this fitting a couple turns – if fuel is not running, and it should be, you are on the right track. Leave it loose and keep checking.



What is restricting fuel flow? There are several points to check in whatever order you decide. Is the fuel cap venting? Loosen cap to make sure it is. If you hear a whoosh when you loosen the cap it isn't venting and it should be

Is there a filter in the glass bulb? — these filters tend to clog up and with gravity feed there in no pressure to move the fuel through the filter. The cast iron sediment bulb has a

screen in it and could be clogged. Open the drain valve to see if fuel will drain from the bulb.

At the top of the carburetor there is a strainer, with a 5/8 wrench remove this strainer to see if it clogged. There could be water or debris in the carburetor bowl and the jets.

To check inside the bowl use a 9/16 wrench to remove the other hex fitting on the bottom of the carb. (the most forward one) this will allow the lower casting to drop away from the upper casting to look for water or junk in the float bowl.

If the float has not dropped down give it a very gentle tap and if it drops down fuel should begin to flow. Check what is in the float bowl – is it water, dirt?

If nothing is flowing from the tank because it is plugged you can disconnect the fuel line from the carb (9/16) and blow back into the tank to dislodge dirt from the tank outlet.

If something is flowing from the tank make sure it is not water – let it drain into a container so it can be checked.

NOTE: Cars that are driven regularly have much less problem with today's ethanol gasoline. A car that is stored will collect water. If the car is seldom driven use Ethanol free fuel to reduce the risk of accumulating water in the tank.

Replace the lower half of the carburetor making sure the venturi and gasket are both in place and don't forget to tighten the 1/2 inch hex fitting loosened earlier.

Also make sure the 1/2 inch bolts from the manifold to the carburetor are tight, and the (11/16 inch) manifold nuts to the block are also tight.

Comments:

When cranking the engine and holding the choke closed for just a couple seconds, there should be fuel at the choke plate or dripping from the carburetor throat.

Something else to check. If the carb is flooding the float may have a hole in it. Remove the float and shake it. If you detect any gas in it, replace it.


