

Here are some reasons I love October: school has started, the weather starts to cool down, fall and Halloween decorations are abundant and it is a great time to get out and drive your Model A.

"You can know or not know how a car runs and still enjoy riding in a sweet car." The exciting Model A news at our house is that Rick (with help) installed a new Burtz Block engine, made in China, in our Victoria. I've asked him a few questions about his experience.

LOUISE Why did you want to install this new engine in your car?

RICK I wanted better reliability and less engine vibration.

LOUISE What were some of your challenges installing the engine?

RICK There we're several challenges. One was finding an appropriate oil pump. Another was assembling a modern style engine. I also needed to install an external oil filter and an oil pressure adjustment system. Dennis Kliesen was invaluable in solving these problems.

LOUISE I know you had to wait for the engine to arrive from China, and there was some frustration in getting correct parts. Was it worth it? Would you recommend this engine and process to other club member?

RICK Definitely worth it! I would recommend it to other club members if they have the knowledge and experience to deal with modern technology and engine building equipment. If not, find a qualified mechanic who does. As for me, I'm looking forward to future tours in our newly smoother more reliable car!

He graduated from CSULA with a degree in Industrial Arts.


Rick bought his first Model A as a teenager. He and Judy joined the OCMAFC in 2015.


