

Highlights of the June Tech Seminar

On Saturday 9 July about 25 club members (and a few good spouses) traveled to Rick and Louise Hall's home to attend a tech seminar/talk on the latest updates on the Burtz engine as well as to hear about the exploits and experiences that member Dennis Kliesen had in his recent mid cross-country trip out to Kerrville, Texas for the MAFCA National Convention.

Dennis started off with good reports on the Burtz engine with the new Burtz head. Though driving mostly at night, he easily maintained an average speed of 58mph while keep engine temps well within proper operating levels. On his trip out and back he noted more reasonable gas prices...but unfortunately that didn't transfer to hotel costs; something to keep in mind in your travels this summer, whether by modern or Model A vehicles. The convention itself sounded interesting, though the high temperatures tempered many activities which

was unfortunate – hopefully better luck in Albuquerque, NM where the next national convention will take place! Leonard Nettles also led a discussion about the Burtz engine. There was a good discussion on oil pumps and its pressure relief valve for the Burtz engine. Both Dennis and Leonard have some different ideas on how to approach this part of the engine. A lot of questions asked, and answered, regarding the work required once your Burtz engine arrives at your door step (I know our fearless editor was interested in this part of the conversation). Besides deburring, cleanliness is the name of the game, and Leonard offered the use of his cleaning rack to members that purchase the Burtz engine.

Many thanks go out to Rick and Louise for lending us their garage and patio, as well as to Dennis Kliesen and Leonard Nettles for taking time to lend us their experiences with the Burtz engine. Never to fear, we have



another seminar planned out to Leonard Nettles garage around the November timeframe to talk more Burtz as well as other ideas that are brewing.

Seeing as how I'd heard of this, but had never actually seen it, I thought it might be a good idea to share this with other members who might not have seen it either.

Mike Edmonson, Aaron Magdaleno, Kevin Schaner and myself all decended upon Joe Goff's family's purple/silver 31 Phaeton to try to determine the source of a horrendous noise coming from the bell housing area. Not exactly clear why it happened, but the starter had pulled the ring gear off of the flywheel about 1/4". The starter is indeed a 12 volt starter, so it's a bit of a mystery.



The photos show what we found after we had pulled the motor out. Sho-nuff, there she is...!!! That ring gear is supposed to be snugged up tight to that ledge on the flywheel, NOT

a 1/4" away from it! We also found that a few teeth had been damaged in some areas. Seeing as how that side of the gear is AWAY from the bell housing and back of the engine block, in theory it shouldn't have been able to contact anything. Maybe it's from the newer style Bendix gear? Maybe from a low battery and a starter not full engaging with the ring gear? Or maybe it's just that the ring gear was pulled 1/4" away from the starter gear and thus the gears were no longer engaged fully. All rather interesting.
