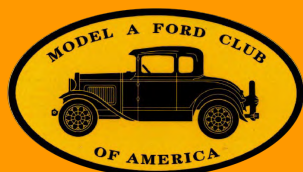

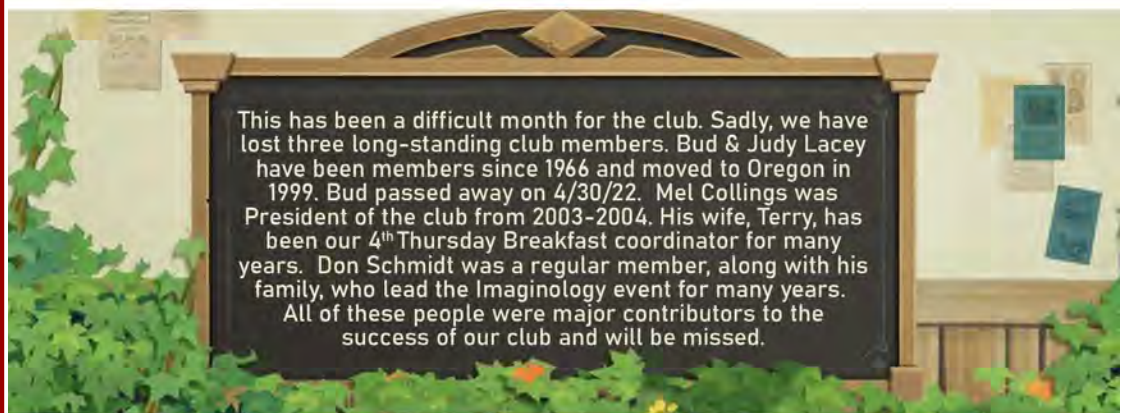

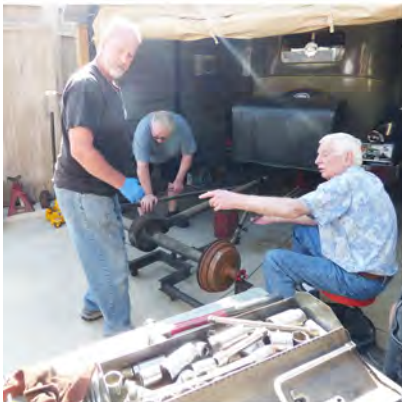

Jim's Tech Tips ~ "Grease Fitting Added to 7-tooth Steering Gear"

The Ford Service Bulletin from September, 1928, has a brief mention of adding

NEW LUBRICATOR FITTING IN STEERING GEAR HOUSING

The drilled hole in the steering sector shaft, through which the lubricant in the steering gear housing was carried to the sector shaft bushings, has been discontinued. Sector shaft bushings are now lubricated by means of a lubricator fitting placed in the steering gear housing. (See A, Fig. 570.) Lubricant should be forced into this fitting every 2,000 miles.

Should an instance arise where it is necessary to install the present design sector in an old steering gear assembly, it will be necessary to install a lubricator fitting in the housing. This is done by drilling a $21/64$ " hole $2-3/32$ " back from center line of flange where housing is bolted to frame. (See Fig. 571.) The hole should be drilled through housing and sector bushing and then tapped with a standard $1/8$ " pipe tap. When tapping the hole, do not tap too deep. The hole should be tapped just deep enough so that when the lubricator fitting is screwed down tightly approximately two threads on the fitting will remain above the surface of the housing. (See Fig. 571.)

You fill the steering gear box with the very heavy and thick 600W oil, and you squirt a little grease into this fitting that you are adding. The grease will lubricate the sector shaft, and it will form a little bit of a barrier that will slow down (not stop) the 600W gearoil from seeping out the sector shaft.

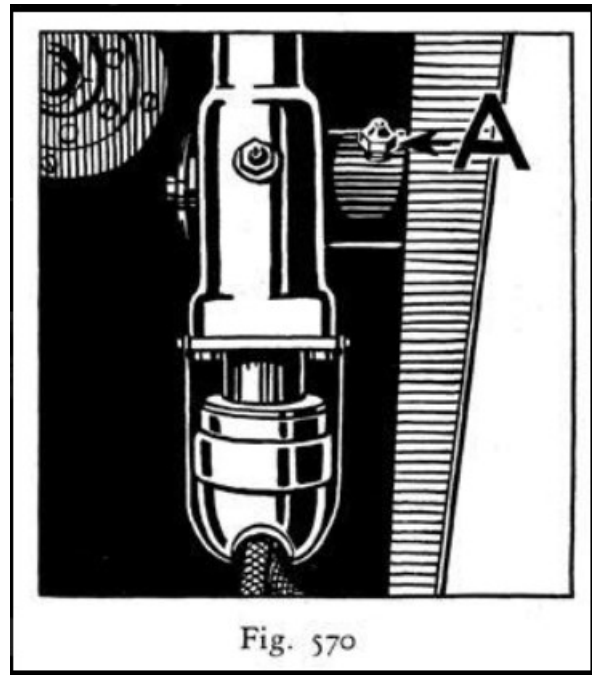

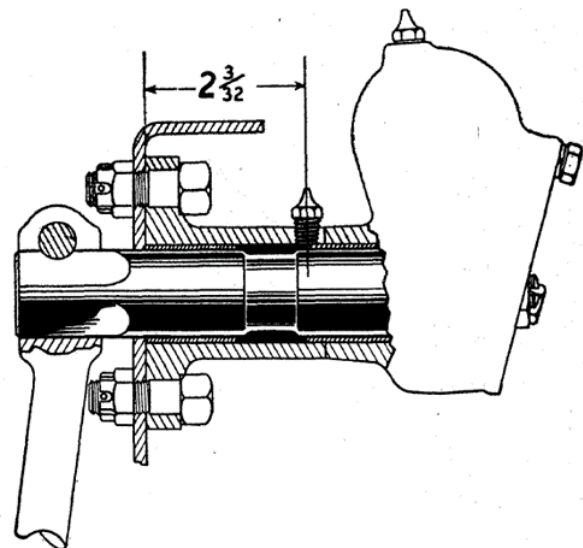

Highlights of the March's Technical Seminar

While March would be a better month to get our Model A's "up to snuff" for general driving and touring purposes, we chose to delay this technical seminar until April so we could all focus on our wonderful pancake breakfast – again, a shout out to everyone that participated and helped us get THIS event back on the road again too!!!

Back to our wonderful Model A's.....on Saturday, 9 April we had a workshop focused on annual maintenance, preparation for tours and some items you might want to bring along with you on a tour or longer drive (keeping the upcoming Mt. Baldy Tour in mind). A big thanks, once again, to Richard Parrish and the use of his backyard, tools, and lift; the lift makes some of our annual maintenance so much easier. Annual maintenance discussed included such topics as oil changes, lubrication points, and changing of water or antifreeze/coolant. We had a healthy discussion on types of oil, which will of course go on forever (10/30, 10 40, 15/40 , 20/50, or just plain straight 30wt – and even preferred brands!). We also discussed types of antifreeze and how the more modern "extended life" antifreezes are not only inappropriate, but even harmful to the Model A radiator and cast iron engine. We should be looking for the good old-fashioned green antifreeze comprised of ethylene glycol and uses "inorganic acid technology" (IAT) that Prestone makes. We also discussed alternatives to antifreeze which will be the topic of a future article.

As for tours, items to bring along included proper fan belts (why does Don Ratzlaff come to mind?), an extra distributor that is timed to your car (or maybe even one that isn't – using the Nu-Rex timing wrench timing is now quick and simple), condensers – both original style and modern, tools such as a

wrench and socket set to match the various sizes on the car, inner tubes (and maybe checking to see how that spare is doing on your car – note to self, I discovered mine was completely flat!) and maybe even a jack and some blocks of wood should you need them to elevate your car to proper height. Just a few of the items that came to mind. And a checklist was also made available to ensure we didn't forget anything (these are still available in a pdf format – just ask and I will email them out to you) before pulling your Model A out of the garage.

Lastly, several members took advantage of Richard's lift to change oil, lube the various points, and other aspects of annual (or semi-monthly if you drive your car that much) maintenance. Darwin Kibby changed his oil and finished up a lube job that he started back at home. This was also a good opportunity to inspect all areas found under the car without rolling or crawling around on your back. For newer members we also discussed the braking system and other potential problem areas; Darwin's car made for a great guinea pig! Frank Mowrer also had his souped-up Tudor there to both change and spill his oil (shhhh, don't tell Richard).

Looking to next month, our next tech seminar will be on May 21st at Don Dormeyer's home. Topic will be another one of those annual maintenance items: Brakes. We will discuss the how-to's and have the space to adjust 3-4 sets of brakes at a time, so plan to bring your Model A to this seminar as we want to adjust as many brakes as we can. (And Eric Engle has a special tool available to those that participate!)

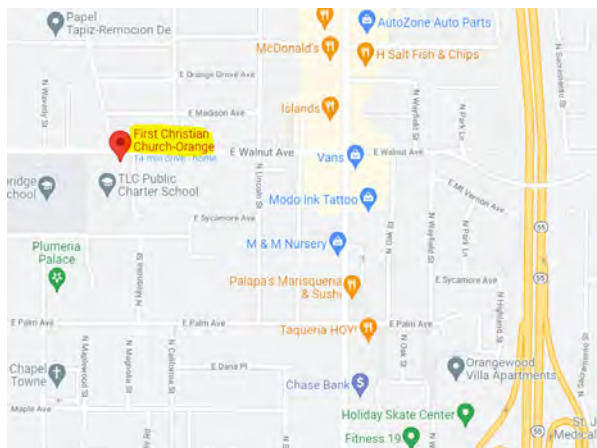
