We had a twenty member gathering at Don & Mary Dormeyer's home to enjoy fresh coffee and donuts. The topic of conversation was about prepping your car for tours, mostly short ones. The opportunity to get your car ready for the upcoming events would take place after the discussion. The information was just a few items I laid out as sort of a check list. The full maintenance schedule is listed on the OCMAFC website.

I would like to note that we were joined my three lovely ladies seeking information about their phaeton. They were Kaci Terens, (our Era Fashions Chair) her mom Joni and aunt Teri. I'm so pleased that they attended the seminar.

Starting on my list, some items that I think are overlooked are: the Distributor (lube cam, put oil in base and cam hole), check oil in transmission, differential and steering box. Check battery voltage and water level. Wheel torque (jack and lug wrench in car)? Generator ok? Some other points mentioned by members were first aid kit, reflective triangles (for if you break down) and your AAA card. After the discussion, we then went to the actual work. Mike Edmonson did tire work by using balance beads in a pair of his tires. I inspected my points and found them needing replacement. I tried the vacuum gauge diagnostic and found normal indications on my car. Darwin did some adjustments on his car also. Generally, the members know their cars and what they need. Hopefully, I brought up some items that might be overlooked.

I want to thank Don Dormeyer (who was suffering from a recent tooth extraction). Thanks for putting up with us.



Sunshine & Sorrow

Sunshine: Being a member of this club with its many activities and making new friends.

Sorrow: Our pancake coffee brew master, David Hoonsbeen pulled a thigh muscle several days before the big day. Very painful and has been in physical therapy for several weeks. Dennis Kliesen woke one morning last month, bleary vision in one eye, then the next day, could not see out of either eye. Scheduled to see an UCI inflammation specialist for *panuveitis* on June 1. Multiple drops are administered several times/day for pressure behind the eyes. Norm Kredit has his forearm all bandaged due to *squamous* cell skin cancer. These are cells that are found in top part of the epidermis. Both *basal* and *squamous* are relatively slow growing, but still need to be closely monitored. Now Terry Carey was bike riding (for his health) and fell, breaking his right wrist and two ribs. Hey, come on now, let's give him credit for being active! He's bummed because he missed Fairhaven Memorial Day celebration first time in 10 years.

*So many things are overwhelming right now. Just remember
to take one step at a time, one day at a time.*

Recently I have been chasing a number of gremlins out of my 31 coupe. One of those gremlins was very hard to track down and took me through my entire ignition system before I was finally able to track down the problem. Turned out to be the brand new rotor for my distributor purchased from a local outlet. The brass rivet that mounts the 2 pieces of metal to the plastic was seriously damaged in the manufacturing process. The swedging of the rivet at the factory caused it to split in several places, thus allowing the whole metal assembly to come loose after a very short 5 mile drive and not make a good electrical connection. My car simply died! I had a devil of a time finding the problem. Lucky for me my car was in my garage when it died. Included are photos of the damaged rotor that I pulled out after a short drive, a brand new rotor still unopened that plainly shows the problem rivet, and then a new rotor that has been properly swedged over.

Notice the difference in the rivets: no splitting! So, customers beware. Closely inspect these parts **BEFORE** opening the package. If you see any splitting of the rivet, get another that has been properly swedged.



Cooking with Your Model A (Manifold Cooking) *by Becky MacIntosh*



You may have heard about this and it is not unique to the Model A community. There are even cookbooks available. Old issues of the Restorer and Model A News talk about it. Lots of recipes available by searching the internet for “manifold cooking”.

So what is it?

Before heading out for a tour, you put together a package of food wrapped securely in foil with the package being about 3” x 10” in size when wrapped. Place the package in your engine compartment (top of the exhaust manifold is the most often quoted) and then head out on a tour of 20-60+ minutes. Stop at a

park and enjoy your hot meal right off the engine in your Model A!

EGGS ON CHEESE PIE - Cooking distance: 55 miles

PORSCHE POTATOES - Cooking distance: 140-200 miles

PORK TENDERLOIN - Cooking distance: 250 miles

GARLIC SHRIMP - Cooking distance: 35-40 miles

SALMON WITH DILL - Cooking distance: 40-45 miles

CHICKEN WITH PEPPERS - Cooking distance: 60 miles

Be careful! There are things to be mindful of...

If not carefully wrapped, food and liquid may leak onto your engine...not good.

Place package onto “cold” engine to avoid burning your hands.

Do not let package interfere with accelerator linkage, distributor control or spark plug wires.

Allow plenty of time for cooking and use cooking spray or liquid to avoid scorching food. Exhaust manifold can reach temperatures well above boiling point.

I hear that OCMAFC did some of this in the old days and compared recipes upon arriving at a park location. Their first try...they found they did not travel far enough and food was not fully cooked. May want to just plan on manifold “warming” the meal. Want to try it?




