Highlights of the May Tech Seminar

Lubrications and oils

Braving the rather cold Saturday morning, about 25 members showed up to enjoy fresh hot coffee and warm donuts. First of all I would like to thank Leonard Driver for the fresh ground coffee and Richard Parrish for the use of his home and lift. Special thanks goes to David Knapp for an informative presentation of all lubrication point on our Model A "victim"....Gerald and Diane Gaughen's beautiful 31 "Vicky". aka "Betsy".

"victim"....Gerald and Diane Gaughen's beautiful 31 "Vicky", aka "Betsy". Dave covered safety concerns, a wide variety of possible products, which products to use where, and all "hidden" oil spots. For example: Oil hole on top middle of front cross member to oil front leaf spring (30-31 has a "Crank Guide" mounted on cross member with a hole inside for oil).

A myriad of sample products were displayed, and where each one might be used, or NOT used, according to **Dave's** experiences with them. For example; the problem with white lithium grease, it tends to dry out and harden. WD-40 is a good product, but will NOT stop rust from reoccurring.

Products recommended??? LPS (Lubricates, Penetrates, Stops rust) that has a WIDE variety of products that are excellent for all sorts of applications.. Red N Tacky is also a good product. Watch out though, it stains clothing! Wear your "grubbies"!

Safety concerns include: wearing gloves (keep your hands clean and save your skin from harmful chemical effects), safety glasses to keep chemicals, grease/grime out of your eyes. And lastly, be SURE that your lift, and/or floor jacks are working perfectly. Don't forget to use those body stands!

After Dave's presentation and much round-table discussion, we worked our way over where "Betsy", the Gaughen's Vicky, was sitting. After a quick oil change, we then proceeded to go through some of the lubrication points and the "hidden" ones we don't usually think about. There was a chance that some of the lubrication points on Betsy hadn't been

touched in a long time, so this was a very successful seminar! Betsy was thrilled, no doubt! Thanks again, Dave, for a great and informative seminar.

New Laws Take Effect

As we head into the new year, several new California traffic safety laws passed during 2023 took effect on Jan. 1, 2024 (unless otherwise noted).

<u>Vehicles: Registration - AB 256 (Dixon)</u> Existing law requires current month and year tabs to be displayed on the registered vehicle's rear license plate. Beginning July 1, 2024, and until Jan. 1, 2030, a violation of vehicle registration shall not be the sole basis for any enforcement action before the second month after the month of expiration of a vehicle's registration. However, if a vehicle is stopped for any other Vehicle Code violation, enforcement action for a violation of vehicle registration may be taken before the second month following the month of expiration. Late registration fees from the Department of Motor Vehicles will still apply.

<u>Vehicle Removal: Expired Registration (AB 925, Ta)</u> Requires a peace officer or traffic enforcement official to verify the lack of current vehicle registration with the Department of Motor Vehicles before towing a vehicle for expired registration longer than six months and prohibits the vehicle from being towed if the officer or traffic enforcement official does not

have immediate access to those records. Vehicles: Speed Safety System Pilot Program - AB 645 (Friedman) The cities of Los Ange-

<u>venicies: Speed Safety System Fliot Program - AB 645 (Friedman)</u> The cities of Los Angeles, Oakland, San Jose, Glendale, Long Beach, and the City and County of San Francisco may install a limited number of cameras to enforce speed limits for a five-year pilot period in school zones and designated "safety corridors" – locations that have a high occurrence of fatal and injury crashes – and areas known for illegal street racing. Recorded violations will be subject to a civil penalty.

<u>Vehicles:</u> Stopping, Standing, and Parking - AB 413 (Lee) Designed to increase visibility at crosswalks, this law prohibits parking or stopping a vehicle along a curb at least 20 feet from a marked crosswalk or 15 feet of a crosswalk where a curb extension is present. The regulation only applies to the side of the road of the vehicle's approach to the crosswalk. Local jurisdictions may establish different distances through local ordinances by marking areas with signs or paint.

<u>Cruising - AB 436 (Alvarez)</u> The law removes city and county authority to regulate cruising via local ordinances. Additionally, the law legalizes "lowrider" vehicles to cruise California's streets, by removing the height restriction on lowered vehicles.

<u>Emergency Notification: Ebony Alert: Missing Black Young - SB 673 (Bradford)</u> This legislation establishes the "Ebony Alert," which allows law enforcement agencies to request the CHP to activate an alert for Black youth, including young women and girls between 12 to 25 years of age, who are reported missing under unexplained or suspicious circumstances,

at risk, developmentally disabled, cognitively impaired, or who have been abducted. <u>Emergency Services: Endangered Missing Advisory - AB 946 (Nguyen)</u> This new law will aid in the recovery of missing persons who do not meet the age restrictions associated with the AMBER and Silver Alerts. The new law authorizes law enforcement agencies to request the CHP activate the "Endangered Missing Advisory" for public distribution of missing person information within appropriate geographical areas when specific criteria is met. Drive safe!




