

# ACCC Update: Internal Combustion Engine Ban Prevention Bill Passes by David Knapp

I know many of you keep up with California's legislative and Federal legislative activities—so for you this may not be news. As we all know, following the activities of both political factions is important as they do not necessarily move in lockstep. Just so we are all on the same page: according to information from the Association of California Car Clubs (ACCC), the U.S. House of Representatives have passed a bill to prevent the ban of internal combustion engines. The Senate version has been read twice and was referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works.

U.S. Representative John Joyce (R-PA) introduced H.R. 1435, the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act," a bill designed to protect Americans' right to choose the technology that powers their motor vehicles. The bill was introduced in response to the California Air Resources Board's plans to ban the sale of new internal combustion engine vehicles by 2035. The Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act would restrict the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) from issuing a waiver for regulations that would ban the sale or use of new motor vehicles with internal combustion engines. The bill is important to stopping CARB's plans to ban ICE vehicles, which requires the EPA to waive federal preemption provisions in the Clean Air Act in order for California's zero-emissions vehicle (ZEV) mandate to go into effect.

As next steps the House Energy and Commerce Committee passed H.R. 1435, the Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act, and H.R. 4468, the Choice in Automobile Retail Sales (CARS) Act. These bills seek to preserve vehicle choice for consumers and prevent the federal government and the State of California from choosing only one form of technology (such as electric vehicles) (EVs) over the many others to achieve their emission reduction goals.

H.R. 1435, the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act," is a bill prohibiting the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) from issuing a waiver to California for regulations that would ban the sale or use of new motor vehicles with internal combustion engines (ICE) in the state by 2035.

Ù.S. Senator Markwayne Mullin (R-OK), the co-chair of the Congressional Automotive Performance and Motorsports Caucus, recently introduced S. 2090, a Senate companion bill to H.R. 1435.

Bill S. 2090 is intended to protect Americans' right to choose the technology that powers their motor vehicles. S. 2090 includes the same text as the House bill (H.R. 1435) that U.S. Rep. John Joyce (R-PA) introduced in March. H.R. 1435 and S. 2090 respond to California's plans to ban the sale of new gas- and diesel-powered cars and trucks in 2035 unless certain conditions are met. If passed into law, the legislation would prevent the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) from allowing California's Zero Emissions Vehicle regulations that would ban the sale or use of new motor vehicles with internal combustion engines from taking effect.

### Ron's Mini-Tech Tib

There is an all too common problem with the original style of gasoline shut-off valves. The original valves are "Barrel" type construction and are prone to leaking just a bit when in the "Off" position. The new style valves are a "Ball Valve" design that do not leak. However, when purchasing the "Newer" design of shut-off valves, be SURE to also pick up the newer pencil screen filters, as they have a larger opening on the newer style base. The old style filters will NOT fit snugly in the newer style valves and will fall out in your tank!

Be <u>SURE</u> to get new ones that fit properly!




