## CPR / AED CLASS

Almost 30 of our club members showed up for a CPR/AED "familiarization" class this day. Led by Jim and Sylvia Ellis, our newest club members. It was an exceptionally informative class for everyone! Jim, a retired Costa Mesa Fire Chief and Paramedic, and his wife, Sylvia, were VERY knowledgeable about the subject matter, to say the least. This was probably one of the best seminars this club has ever had!!

The first 5 minutes, after a person has had a "full arrest" heart attack, are the most critical for survival! The sooner CPR can be started, the greater the chances are for that person to survive! And one of our club members, Norm Kredit, had a <u>VERY</u> timely story of his own heart attack when he was working out in a gym years ago and one of the employees there knowing exactly what to do. That "<u>HERO</u>" ended up saving Norm's life. You just never know when you might need these skills, so be ready...you just might someday save someone's life.

The "AED" is becoming more and more commonly found in businesses, malls and work places. These pieces of equipment are an amazing life saving tool that actually talks the person though the entire process.

Looking ahead, at some point in the future, we will be holding a basic first aid class, that I'm SURE will be of great value for everyone. It's nice to know exactly what to do when someone might have a cut finger, minor laceration, or maybe even a broken bone, that needs to be mended PROP-ERLY, until the paramedics, or hospital staff can take over.

All in all, this was a very well received hands-on class that everyone thoroughly enjoyed. Fantastic job, Jim and Sylvia!! Thank you, and welcome to our Model A family.

### TECH -TIP By Rick Hall

Many of us with "touring" Model "A's" have installed alternators for improved lighting, reliability and faster starting. There are many suppliers of kits for installing a Delco (GM) 6 volt or 12 volt alternator on a Model "A", but the kits do not insure proper alignment of the pulley with the water pump and crank shaft pulley. An alternator out of alignment can cause failure of the fan belt and bearings in the water pump and alternator.

I experienced this problem when I installed a 12 volt alternator in my Victoria. I noticed that the alignment was off a little, but figured that the belt would "adjust" for it. Within 300 miles, my new fan belt began to shred and I was getting occasional bearing squeal from the alternator. That's when I knew I had to do something!

Most alternator kits come with an "H" bracket to mount the unit to your front timing gear cover. One company offers an offset bracket, but it is expensive and may not provide the offset you need. An easy and free fix is to remove your alternator and turn it bottom side up. The bottom of the case has a hump which contains a tube that the mounting bolt goes through. You can easily cut off one end of the tube, depending on which way your unit needs to move to provide for proper alignment. Use a cut-off wheel or even a hack saw-case is aluminum and cuts easily. I cut off about 3/8" to put mine back in alignment. Save the piece you cut off and put it on the other end of the tube along with a thin washer. That way, your alternator will stay where it's supposed to when you reinstall it in the "H" bracket on your engine. This process worked perfectly on my car.

If you have not installed an alternator, but would like to, refer to Les Andrews' Model "A" Mechanics Handbook, Vol. II for complete instructions. If you would like to install it with a bunch of old guys eating donuts and offering suggestions, give our Technical Director Ron Andrews a call and we'll set up a technical seminar.







