Highlights of the May Tech Seminar

Shake, Rattle and Roll

I don't know about you, but I really don't like squeaks and rattles—and mine were getting pretty bad. The culprit? Loose-fitting windows. It turns out that excessive window movement in the channel was the cause.

Why was this happening? In my case, the felt window channel installed in my car were the wrong ones—they were much narrower than the door felt retainers mounted inside the door. To make things worse, the same type of felt—meant for the sides of the window—had also been used on the top door rail.

I headed to C.W. Moss in Orange and found a complete kit for my 1930 Tudor. It had all the necessary parts to replace the worn-out components. But when I finally found time to install everything, I quickly realized there weren't many helpful videos on YouTube about fixing this issue.

Just by chance, Mike Edmonson—our Club President—called and asked, "You any good at window stuff?" I replied, "I'll try," and we started working on the passenger door of his 1928 Tudor.

We began by removing the handles, door panel upholstery, wind lace, and the top door rail (held on by three screws). With the window cranked all the way to the top, the regulator should disconnect from the bottom window channel. If you have trouble disconnecting the regulator, try removing the regulator mounting screws to loosen the entire assembly (suggestion: maybe leave one (1) loosened screw in so that the entire assembly doesn't fall inside the door)

At this point, the window should lift out through the top of the door, and you can remove the old felt channel.

The new felt channels come with clips at the top and bottom that hook into the door. (Tip:

The kit includes adhesive, and it's a good idea to apply some to the backs of the channels in addition to using the clips.) Foam rubber strips are also included for the top door rails, where the glass seats when fully closed—these need to be glued into place.

One more thing: there's a flat rubber block the window rests on when fully rolled down. It has a tab that holds it in place. Jennifer Ferrario showed me a great trick—there's a small raised metal stay where the tab goes. If you cut a matching slice in the rubber stop, it fits in much more easily.

I hope this helps on your next window channel replacement!

"Change the Condenser"

On most any Model A tour one of the participating cars will likely drift to the side of the road inoperative. Soon after everyone gathers around someone in the crowd will surely yell out "change the condenser". This knee-jerk reaction has become ingrained in Model A folklore. The truth is that good quality condensers available today seldom ever fail.

Over the years I have seen countless numbers of condensers changed out, but I have only observed one that actually failed, and that was because the ground strap soldered onto the back of the condenser came loose due to an over-heated engine.

The common practice for checking a condenser is to use an ohm meter. It will tell you if it is shorted or open, but not what the actual capacitance value is.



A Honeytek A6013L Capacitor Tester (called a condenser in automotive jargon) is available through Amazon for about \$22. The tester will tell you not only if the condenser is good or bad, but the actual value in micro-farads. Set the pointer on two micro farads.

What I have discovered with my new Honeytek tester is that the good quality condensers from Bratton's test out at a nominal .228 -.235 micro farads. I have never seen any documentation that Henry ever recorded about how many farads (or portions thereof) are required of a condenser to properly operate a Model A Ford ignition system.

It is difficult to describe what a farad is, especially when only a very small portion of one is used in a Model A condenser. A micro farad is but .000001 of one farad



The Honeytek tester is a unique thing to have along on a tour. You can easily test a condenser while it is still attached to a distributor installed in a Model A. Simply remove the car's fuse, and slip a business card between the points. The plus lead of the tester is clipped to the arm of the points; the negative lead is clipped to ground on the distributor.

There are still poor quality condensers being sold by some suppliers. They are easily identified by the ground strap being soldered to the end of the condenser. The good quality ones sold by Bratton's and a few other suppliers will show three little dots on the strap indicating they are stake welded on.

Wagon Tales: Episode 3b by Dave Knapp

"When your brakes break...."

Pressing the brake pedal has been more of a suggestion than an order for a while. No amount of adjusting seemed to make much difference. Interestingly, at the Pancake Breakfast a fellow club member commented on the positioning of the front brake arms on the Woody. He was insistent that there was not enough pitch forward to have good braking (15 degrees forward seems to be the ideal). His recommenda-



tion was brake shims, or pills, that would allow a bit more arm pitch by lengthening the internal rod. Initially, I felt the shims were a little bit of a stop-gap, but they were cheap enough, so I ordered a set, thinking it would be an interesting experiment.

When the Woody's turn came for some 'love', I set out to repack bearings and try installing the brake shims. Upon removal of the first front drum, I was stopped dead in my tracks. Brake

shoes? Shouldn't there be friction material for them to be called brake shoes? Immediately, the project shifted gears. I moved to the rear axle fearing, but somewhat knowing, what I would find. What was the number for Randy Gross again? Yep, new drums, shoes, bearings, pretty much everything you can name—it was time! The more I looked, the worse the state of things became.

On top of new brakes, new bearings, races and rear seals were installed. The rear bearings are certainly going to be a conversation piece at a future tech workshop. The front bearings appeared OK, but after popping out a few races and inspecting them, changing everything just made sense.

While I am working through this project, Dennis Kleisen stops by to visit. Of course, he suggests several "while your at its". I guess that means there will be more Woody tales coming soon and more work for me! Anyway, the Wagon is back together and stops like never before. We no longer need to toss an anchor out when approaching an intersection. Shout out to Randy—thanks for the great work!
